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





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Fishing OFFSHORE ANGLERS GET OUT!

DAVO'S NORTHSHORE BAIT & TACKLE

IN THE Maroochy River, flathead have been in good numbers around Chambers Island on the run out tide. There's also been some good reports of whiting and bream being caught around Black Banks and Cotton Tree. Timing your trip so you're there for the last of the run in tide should see you tangling with some nice trevally. Fishing Nojoor Rd, the tips of Chambers Island and the Cod Hole has been where most of the action has been. Jack numbers are still way up there with plenty of fish taken over the last couple of weeks, getting out early is key. Crabbing has also been excellent over the past week with plenty of reports of mud crabs being caught around the upper Maroochy River.

On the offshore scene, there were a few days last week were the small craft could make the run outside. Mackerel reports have been good with some great catches of spotted mackerel around the Coolum Reef area. The outer Gneerings also fished well earlier in the week with cobia, snapper, sweet lip and tusk fish taken. The good old floater method has been the winning, rigged with larger pillies and slimy mackerel. With the full moon next Monday and if we get some favorable weather the weekend should be a cracker.

Fishing the beaches has been great fun for families with plenty of whiting and dart on offer, looking for those closer gutters is accentual at the moment as the blue bottles have been everywhere. Casting smaller baits of freshly pulled beach worm, yabbies, pippies or peeled prawns have been a great way to get a feed of whiting. Fishing the early morning tide this week should see you come into contact with a few tailor. Good baits of pilchard or mullet fillet on a three ganged hook is the way to go.

80 per cent of strokes can be prevented, and we can all take simple steps to reduce our risk.

Get your blood pressure checked regularly. Blood pressure is the key risk factor for stroke, but it can be managed. The number of strokes would be practically cut in half (48 percent) if high blood pressure alone was eliminated.

Manage your cholesterol – High cholesterol contributes to blood vessel disease, which can lead to stroke.

Eat a healthy balanced diet – avoid sugary drinks and cut the salt.

Exercise regularly – Inactivity causes weight gain and contributes to high blood pressure and high cholesterol. Quit smoking - Smokers

have twice the risk of having a stroke than non-smokers.

Only drink alcohol in moderation - Drinking large amounts of alcohol increases your stroke risk through increased blood pressure, type 2 diabetes, obesity and irregular heart beat (atrial fibrillation).

Remember this list and take your first steps towards reducing your stroke risk in 2019. It could save your life.
