

do, with all training and uniforms provided for by the group and Brendan stated that there were many ways the SES help out.

"Fires and storms are likely to be two of the main threats to the region over the coming summer and Brendan said being aware and prepared could make a huge difference.

"Be aware of leaks in the roof and cleaning out the gutters as well as what items you have laying around that could become mobile in the event of big winds," Brendan said.

The open night on November 19 will also serve as a recruitment drive of sorts with the Coolum SES having only 12 volunteers – some of which are only recent additions after the Peregian fires.

"I'm not interested in ability – I'm interested in availability," Brendan said.

"If people say they are available, then they're enthusiastic and we will find something for them to do."

No matter what your age, ability of skill set – the SES will have a role that you can

Brendan recounted that one of his most rewarding moments during his 35 years in the SES was when deployed to North QLD to help out after one of the cyclones in the mid 2000s.

"I was with a team and we were walking around after the cyclone and we came across some people and we were in our uniforms and they asked if we were there to help them – they hadn't had anyone come by as yet, and they couldn't do anything as their washing machine and other furniture was in the way and being old pensioners they couldn't move anything, so we got in and moved the items and it made all the difference for them – something as little and simple as that."

The Coolum SES meet once a week on Tuesday from 7-9pm and are eager to have more volunteers come on board and are calling on all of the community to join them at their open night on Tuesday November 19, and more information can be obtained by calling Brendan on 0400 997 542

ONCE again Quota International Coolum Beach will be the recipient of money raised from the sale of The Shelly Dress campaign.

For the third year in a row fashion designer Leina Broughton has designed "The Shelly Dress" and over the next month for every one sold, \$25 will be donated to her chosen charity - Quota International Coolum Beach.

Three years ago Leina came up with the idea of designing The Shelly Dress and chose friend Shelly Horton who is a journalist, TV presenter and MC as her muse and asked her to model the locally designed clothing, and The Shelly Dress also served as a way to give back to the community.

Leina asked Shelly to nominate a charity to receive funds from the sale of each Shelly

Dress and because Shelly knows how hard her Mum Lindy works volunteering with Quota - Ms Horton nominated Quota International Coolum Beach where Lindy has been a member for nearly 30 years.

A look back in time

A LONG TIME COOLUM RESIDENT WITH A PASSION FOR LOCAL HISTORY

It's dry, isn't it?

ONE OF the most commonly heard phrases around our area during the last few weeks has been the hackneyed "It's dry, isn't it?" Much of the country around and to the north of our area has been burnt. The subject of climate change comes into almost every conversation, and dire predictions of desperate, ongoing drought are made, and repeated over and over. Most of us picture our area as green, verdant jewel beside a vivid blue ocean, but we have not experienced - or have forgotten - that we have had brown, extremely dry times as well.

Nearly two hundred years ago, in 1823, four cedar-cutters from the Illawarra area south of Sydney were caught in a storm and blown off course. Thinking that they had been blown towards Tasmania, they unintentionally navigated northwards. After three weeks, John Thompson died, but his companions, Richard Parsons, Thomas Pamphlet and John Finnegan continued on for another week, eventually arriving in Moreton Bay - landing on Moreton Island and eventually crossing to the mainland near Cleveland. As they continued northwards [still aiming for Sydney] Pamphlet returned to Bribie Island from near the Maroochy River, while Parsons and Finnegan continued, becoming the first Europeans to pass through the Coolum area - on or about September 15, 1823. Finnegan also returned to Bribie Island

and was rescued on November 30, 1823. However, Parsons - who travelled towards Hervey Bay before returning along the coast to Bribie Island - was rescued a year later, declaring that he had seen no rain in his twelve months of travelling, and his rescuer, John Oxley recorded that, "The whole country bore the appearance of excessive drought".

Coolum rainfall figures have only been recorded since 1924, with our lowest recorded rainfall 934 mm in 1957, but Yandina recorded only 494mm in 1902. By 1906, however, central Coolum was named 'Green Hills', and the grass there was declared 'horse high'. Extremely dry years were recorded in 1932 and 1936, and there was a persistent dry period from 1944 to 1946. This led to the erection of a tank on the hill opposite the intersection of Greenoaks Drive and Beach Road, drawing water from a nearby well, to service the campground - by now a valuable part of the local economy. Severe droughts were experienced in 1951 and 1957 [our driest year, with only 934mm in total] as well as 1970 and the period from 1977 to 1979. From 2000 to 2004 - known widely as the 'millennial drought' - we also experienced an extended dry period. Dry times come and go, but each new day hopefully leads us closer to the return of good conditions - maybe with 'horse-high' grass, as in 1906.

Why do we need to share?

RECENTLY, several times I have stopped beside the David Low Way at Marcoola to find swamp wallaby fatalities. I recognise that we are part of nature and I love our swamp wallabies that are a part of the rich biodiversity that contributes to our wellbeing.

I was able to report these incidents to the conservation group Coolum and North Shore Coast Care who are maintaining records of the type and location of wildlife fatalities. Unfortunately, wildlife fatalities including wonderful swamp wallabies are becoming far too common with more land clearing and recent developments like the airport, residential and industrial expansions.

The Sunshine Coast Regional Council (SCRC) has just issued a report extolling the virtues and success of its Environment and Liveability Strategy. Without detailed benchmarking data on numbers and types of wildlife existing in a specific area, the assessment of success or otherwise cannot be shown. There are lots of fine aspirations but little delivery. This strategy is a fail for me and similarly is

a fail for a local community leader I contacted.

While the nomination for the SCRC area to become a UNESCO Biosphere is a positive development, the Council continues to show an unbalanced approach. For every hectare that is conserved, practices to develop large tracts of land, (which are subject to climate change such as coastal and river floodplains) clearly counteract any small advances.

This year the world's largest assessment of biodiversity shared the news that 1 million species are under threat of extinction. Australia's extinction record is poor compared to the rest of the world, and our investment into conservation doesn't do enough to restrain the growing crisis. Locally we need our council to call out the extinction crisis and climate crisis - taking meaningful action with real investment.

Why do we need to share this planet and the region with native wildlife species is the question? The answers are that we are all a part of nature, life is a great gift to share and wildlife biodiversity important to our health and wellbeing.

HOT WEATHER FIRES UP THE FISH

DAVO'S NORTHSHERE

BAIT & TACKLE

WITH the heat we've experienced over the past week the water temperature has risen dramatically in the creeks and rivers. This is the perfect time for anglers targeting mangrove jack. Try live baits around 4-5 inches rigged on two 3/0 octopus hooks. Fishing for jacks at night with soft plastics and soft vibes can also be extremely effective.

Whiting have come onto the bite around the river mouth and Chambers Island flats. Live yabbies, worms and surface lures have all been working well. For best results try fishing the start of the run in tide.

Mud crabs have started to pick up in the river - anglers who are constantly working their pots and using fresh baits have been getting good size bucks.

The motorway bridge has seen some good captures over the past week with trevally, jacks, school jew and bream all hanging around the structure.

Flathead numbers are also good with the area around Bli Bli Islands fishing extremely well - fish over the 80cm mark have been reported and

released.

On the beaches whiting and dart have been the most common captures along the coast with some good models caught in the gutters along Coolum Beach. Beach worms, pipies and peeled prawns have been the go to baits.

Off the rocks at Yaroomba some good sized trevally have been reported, casting stick baits and recovering with big pauses has been working well. Bait anglers have had success with pilchards and bonito fillet.

Offshore conditions weren't the best last week with the winds up most days. There were a few opportunities to get out, with the mornings that bit quieter - those lucky enough to get out were definitely rewarded with some quality fish.

Fishing the outer Gneerings and Murphy's Reef has been good for snapper and grass sweetlip. If heading to the Barwon Banks try fishing the deeper water mark around 90m for pearl perch and snapper. Fishing micro jigs from the PTYD range along with Shimano Colt Sniper jigs are the standouts. Using the suitable size jig to the area your fishing is important. For any more info on technique, jig

weights and colour just drop by the shop.

Mackerel numbers are also starting to improve with spanish mackerel to 12 kg landed on Sunday. Working diving lures along the reef edges seems to be a good technique.
