Gold medal surfing at Yaroomba? 2032 Olympics set to become a reality with State Gov confirming bid

THE QUEENSLAND State Government have confirmed that they will pursue hosting the 2032 Olympic Games with a bid incorporating South East Queensland as the venue, however all levels of Government will need to give the proposal the green light for funding if the bid is to be successful.

Federal member for Fairfax Ted O'Brien, Sunshine Coast Council Mayor Mark Jamieson and the Sunshine Coast Business Council have officially endorsed the announcement and are keen to

STATE GOV CONFIRMS 2032 OLYMPIC BID

see the Games bid become a reality.

After a detailed value proposition assessment, the Queensland based Games in 2032 could deliver significant economic and community benefits for the state.

Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk said that the Games were much more than just a few weeks of sport.

"Hosting the 2032 Olympics and Paralympics could be a game changer and deliver 20 years of accelerated opportunity for our state and that's why Cabinet has made the decision to continue working towards securing a Games – and we will continue to work closely with our partners to ensure we receive the financial support we require from all levels of Government.

"There's more work to do to ensure we are in a position to put a compelling case to the International Olympic Committee (IOC)," Premier Palaszczuk said.

The Prime Minister's representative for a 2032 Olympic Games and Fairfax MP Ted O'Brien is thrilled the Queensland Government is finally locked-in to bid for the

2032 Games.

"We are now officially off and running to secure the Games in 2032," Ted O'Brien declared.

The Morrison Government led the charge for an Olympics bid earlier this year, which was backed up with a commitment of up to \$10 million to progress the bid process.

It is hoped that bringing the Games to Australia would not only provide economic benefits, but also ensure a framework for all Australians to become active in sports.

"If we are successful in our bid for 2032 it will give us a decade long run-up to accelerate the delivery of infrastructure, improve health and wellbeing, boost tourism and trade, build grassroots and high performance sports and so forth, and this legacy will last for generations.

"But we're not there yet," Mr O'Brien cautioned.

Sunshine Coast Council Mayor Mark Jamieson has also welcomed the Queensland Government's decision to support the Council of Mayors South East Queensland (COMSEQ) proposal for a potential 2032 Games.

Mayor Jamieson said the decision by the Queensland Government to back a 2032 bid would provide an unheralded opportunity for the region, the State and the nation.

"Needless to say – as someone who has been on this journey for nearly five years – I am delighted that we now have a firm commitment by the Queensland Government to work alongside the Federal Government and the SEQ Mayors to make this bid happen," Mayor Jamieson said.

Mayor Jamieson further went on to say that the only way the bid could be successful is if all tiers of Government work together to make the proposal a reality.

If the bid is successful the Games could potentially create 130,000 jobs, accelerate the development of infrastructure, boost international tourism spending by more than \$20 billion, and deliver up to \$8.6 billion in new trade opportunities.

again at the upcoming local government elections which will be held in March 2020.

MILK PRICES

Dear editor,
The public is both horrified and disgusted at the audacity of Coles to dupe both struggling dairy farmers and a public more than willing to pay 10c extra for the basic 2L Coles milk to help our dairy industry. Not only has Coles forwarded only 35% of the moneys collected, but raised the price of its basic 2L milk to \$2.40, with no further explanation.

The Australian grocery duopoly have squeezed the fortunes of our agricultural industries to the point that many have had to sell up and

leave - some of which are generational properties. What they are offered did not cover costs. It leaves the door open to higher milk prices for imports and overseas' ownership and control of Australian farms. This big business has smeared its reputation by exploiting both the public and our farmers in a time they are all suffering.

The cost of living is dictated by two grocery giants and petrol companies, making billions at the public's expense. Profiteering from public generosity and empathy, they have shown their true colours. It is an unconscionable move,

which has a detrimental impact on the hearts and minds of consumers and those suffering from the high cost of running dairy farms against the odds, including a historical crippling drought.

Their credibility is ruined. Whose decision was it to short-change our farmers and collect extra millions, when they already make billions in profit for executives and shareholders? They have milked both dairy farmers and consumers dry! It is un-Australian!

A look back in time

CHRISTMAS FUN AT COOLUM BEACH

CHRISTMAS fun at Coolum Beach these days may involve an annual multi-faith carol service, movies under the stars, new bikinis, surf boards and mobile phones and, for many visitors to our town, a week or two in a high-rise apartment with all mod-cons. In earlier times, beach activities at Coolum were considerably different to those enjoyed today - with most visitors camping in tents or staying in guest-houses where they discussed the day's news as they ate shared meals each evening.

In 1923, when a land-sale of blocks between Beach Road and Scrub Road drew many summer visitors to Coolum, it was reported that, "There were some horse races on the beach which

caused much excitement... the best place to watch them from was the surf, where the water was delightfully cool... A large number of campers 'had the pull' over everybody else, with tents to retire into from the sun". As far back as 1925, many people enjoyed participating in, and watching, 'Belle of the Beach' competitions, when young ladies dressed in 'beach pyjamas' and paraded on the beach. These competitions continued into the 1950s, and prizes for winners - worth up to one fifth of a girl's average weekly wage - were offered by the Courier Mail newspaper.

Sand Garden competitions for children under 15, were also popular up to the 1950s. They were run in conjunction with Belle of the Beach

festivities, and held on most major Sunshine Coast beaches from Boxing Day until New Years Day. Each child's entry comprised a 'castle' and a 'garden', decorated only by natural materials found at the beach, and they were allowed 90 minutes to complete their entry. The popular sand garden competitions were widely advertised in newspapers and at schools, attracting many visitors to seaside towns such as Coolum.

By the 1960s Coolum was becoming a desirable tourist destination, although much less sophisticated than today. The tourist market, however, brought little money to the area. The simplicity of a Christmas holiday in Coolum was so different from today's up-market activities that it can best be explained by a request to the Coolum Progress Association, whereby the Association was asked to, "approach the Council requesting that tents be kept off the footpath between the shop on the corner of the Yandina/Coolum Road and the School of Arts [i.e. Elizabeth Street] because in the past pedestrians have been forced off the footpath onto the roadway to avoid guy ropes from tents".

Hoping that you enjoy your Christmas, whether simple or sophisticated... and be glad there are no longer tents on the footpath!

COAST COUNCILS NOW DROUGHT DECLARED

BOTH Noosa and Sunshine Coast council, along with Gympie have been drought declared with 67.4 per cent of the state now affected.

Minister for Agricultural Industry Development Mark Furner said he had accepted the recommendations of the local drought committees based on the significant lack of rain, depleted pasture reserves and escalating concerns about agricultural water supply.

"There are now 41 councils and four part council

areas drought declared, and 16 Individually Droughted Properties (IDPs) in a further five Local Government Areas" he said.

"In these regions, local drought committee members have observed extreme rainfall deficiencies, above average temperatures, poor pasture growth, low soil moisture profiles, failed winter grain, forage and horticultural crops, little to no planting of summer forage and grain crops, and significant concerns about stock, irrigation and rural water

supplies.

"Any producer who is experiencing difficult conditions in any council area that is not drought declared, can apply for an IDP declaration. This gives you the same access to Queensland drought assistance as an area declaration.

Road safety urged over holidays

Assistant Commissioner Keating said Operation Romeo Sleigh will focus on keeping Queensland road users safe over the busy seven-week period.

"Operation Romeo Sleigh will be in effect as of Friday, December 13 and will continue right through until

the first week of school is complete on Friday, January 31," Assistant Commissioner Keating said.

"As always, officers will be focussed on the Fatal Five, ensuring that road users are not negatively affected by not wearing seatbelts, drugs or alcohol, speeding, distraction or fatigue or any other unsafe behaviour.

"This is traditionally a time for family and we want to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to not only arrive at their holiday destinations safely, but also return to them safely as well.

All Operation Romeo Sleigh activities will remind community members and road users of the importance of safe driving behaviours and enforce any identified unsafe behaviours.

Minister Mark Ryan said the end of year period, while

a joyous one, often saw an increase in road safety related issues.

"We know that this time of year means more people using our roads," Minister Ryan said.

"Officers are launching this operation to ensure our safety.

"We are asking everyone to take care and make the choice to practise safe driving behaviour when getting behind the wheel.

"When you are stopped for random driver testing for drugs or alcohol, or see officers out and about over the Christmas and New Year period, know that as always, your safety is their priority.

"Whether it's mobile phone use, speeding or driving tired, do the right thing and make sure everyone gets to their destination safely.

"We hope everyone stays safe and enjoys this holiday season."

WEATHER WINDOWS PROVIDING CRACKER FISHING

DAVO'S NORTHSHORE BAIT & TACKLE

THE WEATHER over the past week has seen limited amounts of fishing with strong northerly winds making the bite harder than usual. Never the less, the keen fishos have been out on the water soaking up the sun and getting stuck into the action. Reports of Large whiting have been present at the mouth of the river between Goat Island and the dog beach with anglers boating fish of up to 40cm and quantities of 25-30cm fish. These fish have been taken on sand worms as well as live yabbies. If you're unsure on how to collect live yabbies, come in to Northshore Bait & Tackle for expert advice and you too will be pumping them in no time.

Flathead have also been prevalent within the lower reaches of the river with large fish being taken on drifted pilchards, as well as large diving minnow hard bodies such as the lucky craft pointer. Remember to always be cautious with large flathead as they are

almost always a breeding fish and if the fish is over 75cm in total length it must be released with caution.

Mangrove jack haven't slowed down either this week with a firing start to the summer season for both bait and lure anglers. The quantity of captures has been up river around the deep holes and rock bars of Yandina and Dunethin Rock, with live baits and salted bonito fillet being the undoing of these ferocious predators. Night sessions around the Cod Hole have also produced some fish for keen anglers. If unsure of how to throw a cast net or where to go, come into the shop and grab a cast net for an expert crash course on how and where to catch yourself a live bait.

Trevally have been abundant in the river with anglers catching a large amount of big eye trevally during the sunset period of the day when fish are willing to come up and smash a popper. Anglers have also caught fish on live baits at the

Fish have been boated around the Gneerings Reef region as well as Coolum Reef. Reefies have also been on the table for those with bigger boats, with anglers boating some quality red throat emperor, tuskies,

pearlies and cobia around the Barwon Banks region. With the warmer waters be sure to have a pilchard floater as there is no better way to pick up a big spanish or spotty mackerel, not forgetting big cobia and tuna also love this method.
