## MP Simpson asking for State Gov to approve veg clearing for drainage

THE STATE Government must slash red tape to urgently approve the cleaning out of drains in Mount Coolum and surrounding areas to improve safety and cut the risk of flooding, State MP Fiona Simpson recently said.

Ms Simpson said that local residents had contacted her as they were concerned the drains were compromised due to red tape, which had seen the width of drainage near the Mt Coolum Golf Club shrink from up to 30 metres to only a few metres.

"Blocked drains can make flooding impacts worse because water takes longer to drain," Ms Simpson said.

"After recent downpours, I was contacted by the golf course and local residents and I've been in discussion with Cr Jason O'Pray and Council as we want to see a solution

put in place urgently.

"Council is normally responsible for the drains but in this case they have to get environmental approvals from State agencies to remove the vegetation which includes mangroves and widen the channel in the drain.

"I support any applications Council makes to widen the drainage channels but I'd

go further to say that there should be standing State Government approvals in place so council can act to keep the integrity of the storm water and flood management system.

"I'm urgently calling on the State Ministers and their agencies to approve council's right to increase the width of this channel within the gazetted drain and to allow them to keep the drains clear and operational in accordance

to the storm management plan for the area.

"While the rainfall was high it wasn't unprecedented, but there will be big rain events again. The lack of efficiency and proper cleaning out of drains is a huge issue and compromises the storm water and flood water management processes.

Ms Simpson has written to the Government Ministers to ask them to act.

## ECQ set to manage local council elections again

WITH the local government elections to be held next month, Noosa Council Chief Executive Officer Brett de Chastel is reminding voters that the election process is independently managed by the Electoral Commission Queensland (ECQ).

"Our residents should look out for information being published by ECQ about the upcoming council election," Mr de Chastel said.

Council will support ECQ by sharing information as it becomes available, but voters

should visit the ECQ website or phone ECQ direct on 1300 881 665 if they have any questions.

"To ensure independence of the election process, council has no role in the running of the election.

"Our only involvement is the management of election signage and all candidates are provided with details of the rules around election signage," the CEO explained.

"This is the same process used at the most recent 2013 and 2016 council elections," he said.

ECQ has advised that early voting will be available from March 16, but if voters are going to be away from the Noosa Shire for the period March 16 to March 28, they should apply to ECQ for a postal vote.

Mr de Chastel said absentee voting is not available for local government elections, so it's important to call the ECQ to discuss your particular circumstances.

ECQ have advised that key dates are as follows:

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# SUAREZ QUESTIONS WHEELIE BIN CHARGES

DIVISION 9 Candidate Maria Suarez is questioning council's practice of pulling profits out of its Waste Management Undertaking, apparently to prop up its 'game changing' mega projects.

"Council's Waste Management Business reported a profit of \$10.098 million for 2018-19 on revenues of \$66.126 million," Ms Suarez said.

"That's a profit margin of over 15 per cent, and it's been happening year after year and to me that indicates that the current Wheelie Bin charge of \$298.60 for residents of Division 9 could well be excessive and needs review."

Ms Suarez further went on to say that the profits made from waste management services in northern divisions could be

propping up big developments in the southern part of the council region such as the Airport and CBD expansion.

"I fail to see why residents should be overcharged for basic services like wheelie bins to prop up the supposedly visionary projects being pursued away in other parts of the shire – which are of no direct benefit to Division 9."

"We are certainly not seeing that money spent on increasing services - basic essential services like the wheelie bin should be charged and provided to residents at the very lowest price possible to cover the costs, otherwise council should improve our services by providing free garden waste bins to all residences and roadside collection of hard

waste."

"A lot of the residents of Division 9 are battlers who struggle to pay for their basic essential services and they don't want to be paying extra so others can have a fancy new Airport or CBD which is of little use to them," Ms Suarez said.

Suarez said she was looking closely at the costs and pricing of rates and the other basic essential services being provided to Division 9 residents with a view to also ensuring they are fair and equitable.

"If I am elected to represent Division 9 you can be assured that I will be working day in and day out to ensure that my constituents are getting a fair deal from council."

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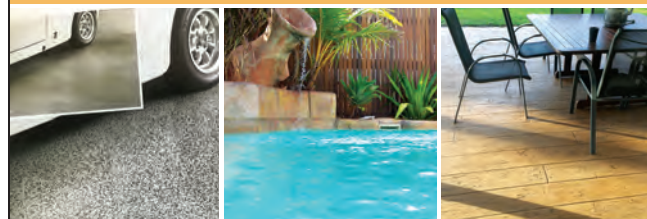

I object in the strongest possible terms to the widespread spraying of pesticides and would therefore like to express equal outrage at the lack of personal responsibility taken here.

If you "chose" to live next to a swamp, what exactly did you expect? You state you want "insect eradication" but do you realise that pesticides also affect frogs, tortoises, birds and countless other species, including humans? Why not choose instead to go and live in the middle of a large city where far fewer insects exist?

Mosquitos, whether you like it or not, are part of our fragile ecosystem and have been brought out in greater numbers by recent heavy rains. We consistently experience ongoing congestion on the Sunshine Motorway. The David Low Way is not meant to be a main thoroughfare as the intent is more for local resident and visitor access to the coastal strip.

With the Sunshine Coast Council and State Government encouraging business developments at the Quanda Park industrial estate and the increasing tourist opportunities for coastal precincts from Mudjimba to Coolum Beach from the airport, the future of the Sunshine Motorway should be a priority to all levels of government.

## A look back in time

## Do you know her name?

THIS WEEK 1300 billboards across Australia will feature female artists – who, up until now, have been largely invisible in the Australian art world, even in the Australian National Gallery, where only 25 per cent of featured artists are female. The Know My Name campaign will feature artists such as Margaret Olley, Emily Kngwarreye and Grace Cossington Smith, but most of the artists featured will be unfamiliar to most. One of the featured artists has a very strong link with Coolum, but it is certain that very few residents of our area will know her name.

Gwendolyn Grant, then Gwendolyn Muriel Stanley, was born in Ipswich in 1877.

She studied at the National Gallery School in Melbourne from 1907 to 1911 and returned to Brisbane in 1912. She married William Gregory Grant, another well-known artist, in 1915, and had two children, Gregor and Ann. Her work was featured in many exhibitions, notably being accepted for entry to the Archibald prize on at least six occasions, and for prestigious Australian Academy exhibitions.

From the 1920s the family frequently visited Gwendolyn's 'Uncle Bill' (Mr. W.A.S. Craig), who owned a house on nearly 4000 square metres of land on the south side of Scrub Road, and he bequeathed this home to her when he died. Both

Gwendolyn and her husband found Coolum a wonderful place for painting. It was said that she 'invariably attracted an audience and rather enjoyed being watched while painting', while her husband found that an audience 'interrupted his concentration'. Gwendolyn's paintings spread the name of Coolum to a wider audience, sometimes through group portraits of beachgoers, sometimes of workers further inland. Her 1942 painting Cane Cutting, which depicted three men cutting and loading cane near Mt Ninderry, was chosen to represent Queensland in the Commonwealth Jubilee Art Exhibition in London in 1952.

During World War II Gwendolyn and her husband were unable to travel to Coolum as often as they had previously, partly because of fuel restrictions, but also because of their voluntary work in Brisbane towards the war effort. In this spirit she offered their house at Coolum to be used as a base for the Volunteer Defence Corps, because it offered such a clear view over Point Perry and out to sea, where vessels travelling up and down the coast could be viewed.

Some Coolum residents still treasure works by Gwendolyn Grant, in oils, pastels, and in watercolours. Some of her paintings are currently on show in the New Woman exhibition at the Museum of Brisbane, until 15 March 2020.

### Have you seen the Blue Tigers?

AS WE become more attuned to the natural rhythms we get enjoyment and pleasure in simple natural things. For instance, on Thursday last week there was a procession of butterflies some blue and some white. The birds were having a bit of a feast on the white butterflies but the blue tigers just continued on their way following a path over

the coastal dunes that they have followed for millennia.

According to Land for Wildlife South East Queensland, the blue tigers are mostly a tropical butterfly that can be seen nearly all year round in North Queensland. They are migratory and fly south during spring and summer reaching southern Queensland, NSW and Victoria.

Huge numbers in the hundreds of thousands result from rain-fall, high temperatures and new growth in their host plant.

By observing nature as did the local traditional owners - the Kabi Kabi people we can learn a great deal of what is safe to eat and what is a seasonal bounty, like the mullet run that once blackened the coastal and the Maroochy River waters with so many fish.

The Kabi Kabi traditional owners see the land as sacred, which can easily be understood with the co-dependency that exists with the healthy land and water for all of nature's creatures, which includes us. I hope that all of the community begins to notice some of these natural phenomena like the but-

terfly migrations which are both beautiful and sustaining for everyone's health and wellbeing.

Butterflies in addition to being beautiful natural creatures are a symbol of transformation. As we face a new election cycle for local government we can hope we see a transformation in the way some elected officials represent community interests.

We will all need to observe and reflect on how both the Sunshine Coast Regional Council and the Noosa Council have served our interests and paved a way for a sustainable future. We just may need to ask - Is there a need for a new group of elected representatives who will be transformers and yet get the balance right?

# RAINS MAKE FOR PERFECT FISHING

## MIKES FISHING & TACKLE

I'M SURE I'm starting to sound like a broken record with another mention of rain, but we're finally starting to see some of the effects that a good flush out can have on the river. While the systems are still dirty there have been some reports of decent catches coming from both the Maroochy and Mooloolah rivers over the last week.

The upper reaches are still very fresh but have been producing some nice bream and bass on baits and small lures. Finding pockets out of the flow seems to be the key here with fish holding up waiting for a feed to pass them by.

The deep holes between Dunethin Rock and Coolum Creek are seeing some nice mangrove jack and even the odd school jew being taken on live baits at night. Soft plastics and vibes are also working well for those anglers willing to put in the time. Zman 4 inch swimmers rigged on a 1/2 oz 4/0 jighead are an excellent choice for these deeper holes and you'll be surprised at the amount of

species that you can catch if they are worked correctly.

With the bigger tides at the start of the week the Bli Bli stretch is starting to clear up nicely and has been holding good bream and flathead along with a LOT of mud crabs. You do have to weed through the undersized specimens and the jennys but there

have been some very full bucks in the mix as well.

Towards the mouth there have been massive schools of jelly prawns pushed up on the edges attracting plenty of trevally and smaller mangrove jack. These have been great fun on light tackle and small surface lures like the MMD Splash Prawn.

Don't forget if you're heading out on the water this week don't forget to drop by Mike's Fishing and Tackle at 99-101 Aerodrome Road Maroochy, opposite Aldi for all your fishing tackle needs and the latest low down on all things fishing and where the fish are hiding and how to catch them.

## Weekly Weather Forecast

THE SUNSHINE Coast has seen some further showers around over the past seven days and these showers have been heavy at times very close to the coast. Some significant rain totals have been observed around the Noosa and Maroochy areas, where up to 125mm has fallen earlier this week. As well we have seen plenty of cloud generated by the onshore easterly winds. Humidity has remained high, however daytime temperatures have generally trended below average due to the persistent cloud cover.

On Thursday we should see a strong upper level

trough move in from the west and this will destabilise the weather significantly with a good chance of showers and thunderstorms during the day and overnight, with some further moderate to heavy rain totals likely. The upper level trough will start moving offshore during Friday, however instability associated with the system should result in some further showers and possibly a thunderstorm, mainly during the afternoon on Friday.

As we move into the weekend, the weather becomes very complex as the strong upper level trough moves into

the Coral Sea later Friday and starts to induce a low pressure trough and possibly an east coast low off the Central Queensland Coast on Saturday. As a result persistent moisture being driven in on the southern side of the low is likely to result in a rather wet day on the Sunshine Coast on Saturday. The east coast trough/low should slowly move south later on Saturday and during Sunday with the potential for some very heavy rain across the Sunshine Coast area overnight on Saturday and into Sunday. There is still some uncertainty regarding the exact location

and strength of this trough/low system, however if it remains relatively close in proximity to the coast, some flooding rain is possible during the Saturday night and Sunday time frame on the Sunshine Coast.

Longer term, the most likely scenario is that the trough/low will move further south into the Tasman Sea on Monday, with the weather improving dramatically on the Sunshine Coast from early Monday morning. We should see a return to mostly fine weather, with a slightly drier air mass as a more westerly wind wraps around the northern side of the low in the Tasman Sea. There is however some potential that the dry weather won't last long with the threat of a few showers and possibly a thunderstorm returning from mid next week.
