AGED CARE

Dear editor,
Aged-care homes have been defined as: "God's waiting room". With 68% of Australians who have succumbed to COVID-19 being aged-care residents. It is a statistic which repeated royal commissions and official enquiries have failed to adequately address or reduce.

To be in "aged care" is almost a death sentence for those whose families have no alternative but to place their elderly in care. But "care" is a word loosely used to describe supervision, while the ratio is often one "carer" to 10 or 20 "clients". It is profit before people. No government or privately owned aged-care home

willingly reduces the client-to-carer ratio. Rising costs across the board have affected the bottom line of every business, especially when cli-

ents have no alterative and no voice. In this age of pandemic hysteria, the aged locked away from families and friends for the duration, are left wondering about their fate.

Many traditional families have their elderly living within their homes, providing for generational interchange and assistance. However, in the third millennium, family dynamics and structures have radically changed, so that many passed their "used by date" are sent away for strangers to care, for economic or practical reasons. This dilemma is exacerbated by patients with dementia, who are often confused or difficult to manage. Time constraints and the tyranny of distance may mean they exist alone. It is the new "normal", but comes at a great human cost.

Remembering John Windolf

We were saddened to initially hear of John's illness and now of his passing. In the words below, John's wife Frances looks back on her husband's life and we thank her for writing this memorial at such a sad time. Our paper and the greater Coolum community was made all the more richer with John part of it. Vale John Windolf – Vanessa Bacon-Hall Editor.

JOHN Windolf, who left us

in late July, after a battle with mesothelioma, called Coolum home for most of his life. Born in Nambour in 1942, John initially lived in Buderim during World War 2 with his mother and sister Caryll, near his grandparents' farm. However, his first memory was when his father, newly demobbed, took him to the edge of Buderim and pointed out Mt Coolum and the smaller hill just southwest of it, which was to be his

Aged four, John joined his sister to walk 4.5 kilometres to the one-teacher school, and the same distance back again. John loved his time at school – he particularly remembered the "5 books in a pineapple case" forming the school library – but in his spare time he would look across from his lonely hill and watch passing ships – even those catching whales for Tangalooma – and dream of sailing ... he thought that would be a much better life than herding cows where the northern third of the new runway is now situated ... the 'bumps' in the motorway near there mark the end of their farm.

John's grandparents moved to Maroochydore and on some Wednesdays his father would row a mile down the creek to the Maroochy River where they could clamber aboard Coulson's mailboat to travel there – after an overnight stay they would return to Coolum Creek wharf, where they could disembark easily. John loved going on those journeys, especially when Mr Coulson let him throw the meat, bread and papers onto the jetties that people now call "the boathouses"!

Later, John became a builder's apprentice, and consequently helped build many homes and buildings around Nambour, Coolum and Alexandra Headland – including the 'Boolarong' where Diane Cilento frequently dropped in to see "the boys". His dream, though, was always to join the Navy and his apprenticeship completed, that's what he did. There were few places available, except for cooks, so he became a cook. However, the Navy then put him through advanced schooling, which led him to the tiny Paluma, a survey ship which operated from Cairns to Torres Strait and Papua New Guinea, where he became a cook and a navigator. He was promoted to Petty Officer while on the Paluma, and transferred to HMAS Cerberus where he became assistant secretary to the Commodore.

In 1970 ANARE was looking for a cook for the 1971 winter season, and a navigator in the summer – and John [having left the Navy because serving personnel could not go to Antarctica] achieved his dream of helping to map the area around Mawson station. At one stage he spent five

months camping on the ice! He loved Antarctica for the rest of his life.


John then caught the travel bug and toured South America from top to bottom, before heading for London. There he sold charts for places near and far, until a rich American asked him to become the navigator on his ocean racing yacht. This led to numerous trips to the continent, and to the Fastnet race [the British equivalent of the Sydney – Hobart]. However, after all this, home called and he travelled back through the Panama Canal.

Quiet Coolum would have been boring to many, but to John it was home, and despite many wonderful trips, Coolum remained "home" for the rest of his life. He worked in his brother-in-law's garage – Murphy's Garage – and also drove school buses, because at that time all secondary students had to travel to Nambour. He even converted a bus into a wonderful mobile home, stylishly fitted out, using his carpentry skills. He was also asked by the local postmaster to record the weather details ... a job he did voluntarily for 45 years.

While at the garage, John reconnected with the people he had known in his younger days and realised that the men who sat and yarnt in the sunshine outside the garage were getting old. He started to write down their stories, and they started bringing him photos, clippings and so on ... This was the start of his interest in local history.

All this time, John thought of his time in Torres Strait, and of Torres' journey in 1606. He had heard of a Spanish nobleman – Don Diego de Prado y Tovar – who had travelled with Torres, in much the same way as Banks later travelled with Cook, and that Prado's writings had been discovered in Manila, and sent to Spain. John taught himself Spanish and spent years translating those writings and in 2006, the 400th anniversary of the first Dutch and Spanish contact with Australia, he was asked to present a paper on the subject to the Queensland Governor.

Nearer home, John met Philip Sharpe, a Queensland herbarium botanist who had a home in Coolum, who encouraged him to investigate the mangroves which had been

"Other names such as George and Edgar Thorogood are prominent and of course I think it was Edgar who donated the land we stand on."



75 YEARS SINCE THE END OF THE SECOND WORLD WAR

THE SECOND World War had a significant and enduring impact on all Australians.

Around 20 years had passed since the end of the First World War and during those two decades our country endured significant challenges, from losing 60,000 men, caring for the many thousands that came back, the Great Depression and at points, sky-rocketing unemployment.

And while all these events had a profound effect on Australia, the Second World War changed and shaped our nation forever — redefining aspects of the economic, domestic and international relations landscape, and influencing social issues such as female employment and Indigenous service.

Almost one million Australians served during the Second World War, fighting in theatres of war across the globe, from Europe and the Middle East through South East Asia to the Pacific. Keep in mind, this was at a time when the total population of Australia was around seven million.

Over 39,000 died and some 30,000 Australian service men and women were made prisoners of war. Most of those taken prisoner were captured by the

Japanese during their advance and capture of Singapore in early 1942. While many Australians who were prisoners of war of Germany had a strong chance of returning home at the end of the war, over one-third of prisoners of the Japanese died in captivity.

Australian women played a vital role, serving as nurses overseas, in auxiliary services in Australia and overseas and as workers throughout the war, maintaining our agricultural and manufacturing interests at home.

We should never forget that this was a war not only fought on foreign lands, but one that came to the Australian mainland. From air raids on Darwin, Broome and across Northern Australia, to midget submarine attacks on Sydney Harbour, there were hundreds of Australians killed.

The fear of an all-out attack on Australia by Japanese forces was very real.

Australia's armed forces employed Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in de-facto units to carry out reconnaissance of the northern Australian coastline, where they assisted locating Japanese and Allied aircraft crash sites. The understanding and connection to country that the Aboriginal and Torres Strait

Islander people had proved to be of great benefit in the defence of the Australian mainland and islands to the north.

And we should never forget the powerful bonds created with our neighbours in the Pacific, particularly on the Kokoda Track where Australians were supported by the locals of Papua New Guinea who carried supplies forward and transported seriously wounded and sick Australian soldiers to safety.

Their compassion and care earned them admiration and respect from the Australians, who dubbed these men their 'fuzzy wuzzy angels'.

This year on August 15, we mark the 75th anniversary of the end of the Second World War, also known as Victory in the Pacific Day.

This is an opportunity for the Australian community to publicly acknowledge the service and sacrifice of veterans of the Second World War, and also recognise the contribution made by all Australians.

More than 12,000 veterans of the Second World War are still with us today.

I encourage all Australians to seize the opportunity to talk to any relative, friend or neighbour who lived through the Second World War to share the experiences and stories of this great generation and to say 'thank you for your service'.

Lest we forget.

enhance the environment as teams of locals often volunteer to lovingly weed and protect it as well as admire and enjoy?

The Minister responded to me advising that a "targeted" consultation will take place to update the plan and that the funding is part of the regional budget and isn't separately identified. She couldn't tell me how much had been spent on maintenance.

I've asked the current Environment Minister to upgrade the park and build upon the \$14,740 spent on repairing the boardwalk on the Xantho-roea walking track in 2017 with further expansions of trails between Ocean Drive and Maroochy River.

However, to do this the park needs an upgraded management plan and dedicated budget to transparently improve this area. How great would it be to open this area up with pathways built to

enhance the environment as teams of locals often volunteer to lovingly weed and protect it as well as admire and enjoy?

As we work together to protect and improve this area, particularly to remove weeds and put in better walk-

ing trails, this beautiful park can truly be enhanced and cherished into the future. However, a management plan is only as good as the actions it requires and they have to be funded and tracked. I'll keep pursuing this as protecting our environment requires maintenance. Our community bush care and coastal care groups have been doing this for years - but they aren't funded to do the heavy lifting and improvements this park needs to get it up to standard it should be in. Let's get this management plan updated with public consultation and inclusion of the whole community - and let's get the money transparently set aside rather than buried in the regional budget. That's what I'm pursuing to get fixed. Let me know what you think as we work together to cherish and improve this beautiful area.

While young people are allowed their blemishes (we sometimes forget what we were like at their age), the vast majority will have the character, the resilience and the adaptability to thrive in a changed world. GETTING ON WITH IT

LAST week we ate out at the reopened Default Restaurant in Maroochydore which had the familiar, friendly, inviting vibe and good food at a reasonable price. I felt the couple who run this restaurant are a good example of the many courageous, resilient and optimistic small business people who reside in our region. These people are just getting on with it in an economic downturn and pandemic.

I hear that another café will also open their doors within the Town of Seaside after being a proven success at another location within the North Shore area. This expansion of business during a downturn in the economy is commendable

and very brave some would say. However, being in small business is courageous and shows a sense of optimism at any time and we wish them every success.

The traits of optimism, resilience and courage are not restricted to the business world. The wildlife, bush and carers of the coast who battle on with conserving our natural environment need these traits in the same measure. Sadly, it was not a very impressive week for the natural environment with swamp wallabies killed on David Low Way (DLW) three days in a row.

The airport expansion works, drainage works, fire burning hazard reduction works and high speed vehicles

on David Low Way mean our wildlife is reducing rapidly in number. Efforts by Coolum and North Shore Coast Care to get crossings for wildlife travelling from the Mount Coolum National Park to the other wildlife habitat in the coastal dunal system have been unsuccessful.

Last week there was no fence to protect wildlife, no wildlife spotters employed specifically to protect wildlife during works and no signage for smoke hazards on DLW with hazard reduction burns. It is time to increase signage and reduce the 70 km speed limit on sections of DLW adjoining the National Park to 60 km.

I pay tribute to everyone in our community during these difficult times as we keep surviving and prospering as well as finding meaning and purpose in our lives.

Let's all get on with it.



On 15 August 1945, Victory in the Pacific was announced.



"We're investing in well-developed projects that are ready to get started and can be successfully completed, with priority given to proposals that engage local contractors and procure from local businesses," Cr Law said.

Coolum Football Club Secretary and Treasurer Elyse Duffy said the club was thrilled to receive the grant, which would help improve access to their barbecue area plus allow people of all abilities to participate.

"We have more than 400 registered members and a lot of children at our club," Ms Duffy said.

"Being able to install accessibility ramps means so much to our club as we'd like to be more inclusive for everyone to access sport and facilities here."

"We have more than 33 teams and host home and away games, so this impacts so many clubs right across the Sunshine Coast."




