COUNCIL PRESERVES FAMOUS WAVE MURAL

ALMOST 20 years ago, local surf artist Owen Cavanagh painted a large mural of Mudjimba Island on the side of an old cane shed next to the Sunshine Motorway.

Since then, the shed and the iconic surf art have become part of the Sunshine Coast Airport and is adjacent to council's construction site of the new international-standard runway - which welcomed its first flight on June 14.

Just last week the final pieces of the old shed were removed for safety reasons and work to preserve what has become an important piece of the community commenced.

Sunshine Coast Airport Expansion Project Director, Ross Ullman, said that in the coming weeks the mural would be carefully propped up with metal framing set in a concrete footing.

"We're pleased to have found a solution to keep this wonderful artwork in the place it has stood for close to 20 years," Mr Ullman said.

Division 8 Councillor Jason O'Pray said the mural is part of the landscape and a welcome sight to both locals and visitors alike.

"The artwork has become a part of what we love about the Sunshine Coast Airport and adds to a long list of things that make our region a special place to visit," Cr O'Pray said.

Artist Owen Cavanagh was both surprised and honoured by the efforts council has made to save his mural. He said the story of the mural

began with a carton of beer and a goal to share his art with his community.

"A friend suggested that the shed would be a great spot for a mural, so I met with the owner at the time and before I knew it, I'd finished the mural and paid for the privilege with a carton.

"In 2011, I gave the mural a 10th birthday present and repainted the whole thing because the weather had taken its toll.

"I've also had to repaint parts that were defaced with graffiti, much to the dismay

of the public who, it turns out, have a deep passion for the artwork.

"I am reminded how much people love and appreciate the wave mural, from kids to adults, on a weekly basis.

"Personally, I couldn't be happier that the mural is going to stay in its original position for the foreseeable future," Mr Cavanagh said.

"I would like to personally thank everybody who has supported me throughout the journey—the community, my family and friends - thank you, with all of my heart."

Call for community feedback to increase coastal resilience

OVER the past 12 months Sunshine Coast Council has been developing 'Our Resilient Coast. Our Future', a long-term Coastal Hazard Adaptation Strategy to help manage the impacts of coastal hazards and increase the resilience of our region.

Sunshine Coast Mayor Mark Jamieson said the strategy was

being informed by the best available science and would improve our understanding of coastal hazards and how they are likely to change over the next 80 years until 2100.

"Last year we asked the community to help us by sharing their insights and experiences about how our coastline has changed over time," Mayor Ja-

mieson said.

"Our residents have a wealth of knowledge and the feedback received from our first round of engagement helped to identify coastal values, better understand the implications of future coastal hazards, like beach erosion and seawater inundation, and thoughts for a resilient future.

"Our coastal areas form an integral part of our Sunshine Coast identity and lifestyle, and are fundamental to the future of our economy.

"Council is now seeking further community feedback on coastal hazard adaptation options, insights on their effectiveness and areas they think each option may be most appropriate.

"Your responses will help inform discussion on how we can adapt to and manage coastal hazards like erosion and inundation in the future.

"There are a number of ways we can respond to coastal hazards, including updates to land use planning, enhancing natural processes, changes and upgrades to existing infrastructure, exploring coastal engineering options and supporting initiatives that help build adaptive, resilient communities.

"This strategy is a key action in council's Environment and Liveability Strategy which seeks to protect and enhance our natural environment and the lifestyle which our residents enjoy.

"It's real action and proactive planning projects like this that help us achieve our vision to be Australia's most sustainable region - healthy, smart, creative."

The community is encouraged to complete our second survey exploring Coastal Adaptation by 5pm on August 30, 2020.

Community are being urged not to become COVID-19 complacent

SUNSHINE Coast Council Mayor Mark Jamieson is calling on residents and visitors to continue their efforts to help keep the Sunshine Coast safe by complying with novel coronavirus (COVID-19) state and national public health directions.

"Generally, most people on the Sunshine Coast have done a great job and continue to do the right thing as we work together to manage the impacts of COVID-19," Mayor Jamieson said.

"But as we are seeing around the world, in other parts of Australia and indeed right now in south Brisbane, it's vital we remain ever-vigilant and maintain social distancing and personal hygiene practices.

"Please remember these basics - stay 1.5 metres away from other people, wash your hands regularly with soap and water or hand sanitiser and ensure you sneeze or cough into your arm or tissue and put the tissue in the bin.

"Do not become complacent - doing the right thing to keep everyone safe is very

simple.

"Queensland Health is asking for you to stay home if you are sick and be sure to get tested if you have any symptoms of COVID-19.

"Testing is essential, no matter how mild your symptoms are."

Mayor Jamieson said Sunshine Coast residents needed to support each other's efforts to comply with public health directions, look out for each other and show kindness and consideration.

"We all have a role to play in slowing the spread and I urge everyone to act responsibly."

ROAD TRIP

THE past month has been a busy one. As soon as restrictions lifted I headed off on my road trip around the electorate. My stops at Coolum and Peregrine Springs were particularly well attended and it was great to hear from so many of you about how the Federal Government can continue to assist you through this health and economic crisis. I also had the opportunity to directly convey your feedback to the Prime Minister during his recent visit to Fairfax and to speak with him about the effect this pandemic is having here and how valuable the Government's continuing economic support is to our region.

JOBKEEPER

The JobKeeper Payment will be extended beyond the end of September under a refined, two-tiered payment system. From September 28 through to January 3 next year, the rate for eligible employees will reduce to \$1,200 a fortnight, while a lower payment of \$750 will apply for employees who worked less than 20 hours a week (in the month of February, pre-COVID). In the following quarter, these payments will be \$1000 and \$650 respectively. You can find links to more information and facts sheets via the News section on my website www.tedobrien.com.au.

CORO-NAVIRUS SUPPLEMENT

The temporary Coronavirus Supplement for those on income support, including JobSeeker, will be extended until December 31, 2020. The \$550 per fortnight supplement continues until September 24 and from September 25 until December 31, the Supplement will be \$250 per fortnight.

ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

Late last month Treasurer Josh Frydenberg updated the

Economic and Fiscal Outlook. For the 2019/20 financial year we have seen a budget deficit of \$86 billion. Also, the official unemployment rate is forecast to rise above nine per cent by Christmas, although the circumstances in Victoria may see this rise further still. Nonetheless, the figures also proved that Australia is in a much better position than other comparable nations across the world and we should take heart from that.

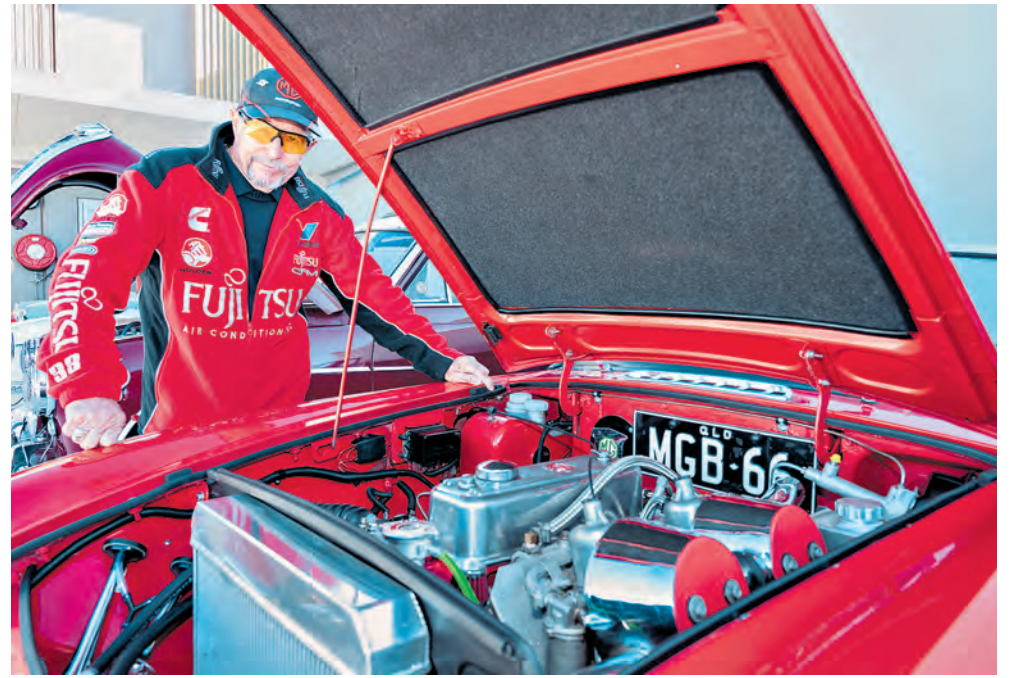

ADDITIONAL WORK HELPS NOOSA BE BUSHFIRE READY

NOOSA Mayor Clare Stewart says the creation of several kilometres of additional fire trails and three extra cool fire burns across Noosa will help better protect the community ahead of the next bushfire season.

"With the devastating fires of last year still front of mind for our residents, I am pleased to confirm that we are adding to our existing network of fire access trails as part of this year's Bushfire Readiness Program," Cr Stewart said.

Council manages over 180 bushland reserves, which equates to about 3.5 per cent of Noosa's land area and maintains about 62 kilometres of fire access trails.

The Local Disaster Management Group received a briefing from relevant agencies about the shire's fire mitigation strategies at last week's meeting.

Mayor Stewart said she was encouraged by the strong collaboration between Council, Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service and the Queensland Fire and Emergency Service.

"I highlighted fire management and mitigation during the election campaign, so it's certainly pleasing to see that increased efforts and control measures are being put in place through this collaborative process," she said.

Earlier this year, council completed new fire access trails at Edington Bushland Reserve, Cooroibah and Eenie Creek Bushland Reserve, plus a controlled burn at Cooloothin Creek Nature Refuge.

Further controlled burns are earmarked for the Waste Transfer Station and Wooroi Creek, if weather conditions are favourable.

Environmental Services Manager Craig Doolan said a further three new fire access trails have been identified as high priorities, with this work to potentially take place in coming months.

This includes a 2.5 kilometre stretch at Heritage Park Bushland Reserve, a new 700 metre trail at Lake Doonella Bushland Reserve, a 500 metre trail at Weyba Bushland Reserve as

well as further work at Peregrine Beach Foreshore Reserve.

Mr Doolan said Council was guided by the advice from Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service and Queensland Fire and Emergency Service.

"We have a coordinated approach which aims to reduce the risk of fire and ensure community safety," he said.

"Our main priority is managing fire access trails," Mr Doolan said.

"It's important to remember that hazard reduction burns may not prevent a bushfire, but are designed to reduce a bushfire's severity and assist firefighters," he said.

Cr Stewart said the community should be heartened by the increased control measures.

"The additional work that has been done certainly complements what other agencies are doing as part of the annual QFES Operation Cool Burn, which occurs between April and August," she said.

"The extra work should give residents an understanding that council is doing what it can in

a collaborative way with QFES, QPWS and other partner agencies, to reduce fuel loads." Cr Stewart said.

Mr Doolan said council adopted a proactive and varied approach to maintenance to reduce the risk of fire and continually monitor bushland areas to ensure community safety.

Cr Stewart said it was equally important for residents to make their own preparations to be bushfire ready.

"We all have a responsibility to equip ourselves with the necessary tools such as an up-to-date Bushfire Survival Plan and clean up around the home," she said.

"It's vital for us all to have a renewed focus on bushfire preparedness, so we ask the community to do their bit by cleaning up around their properties," she said.

Sunshine Coast to Cairns service takes flight

SUNSHINE Coast Airport has spread its wings to fly north for the first time ever, officially

launching its inaugural Alliance Airlines service to Cairns recently.

The new three-per-week service provides a key connection between two of Queensland's

high value tourist locations in line with the current push for domestic travel.

Sunshine Coast Airport CEO Andrew Brodie said the tropical northern destination had been highly requested by the Coast community.

"It's a route that's been long anticipated by local people and the strong passenger loads for the first flight certainly confirmed that," Mr Brodie said.

"This service will also spare locals from making the long drive south to Brisbane to fly north, and will allow us to test the appetite for other regional routes on their wish list.

"It's anticipated this service will facilitate around 40,000 passengers every year and inject \$2.8 million of tourism spend into our region, undoubtedly some welcome relief for local operators."

Tourism Minister Kate Jones said the announcement was a direct result of \$15 million in funding from the Palaszczuk Government to secure direct flights to Queensland destinations and support the economic recovery of the tourism industry.

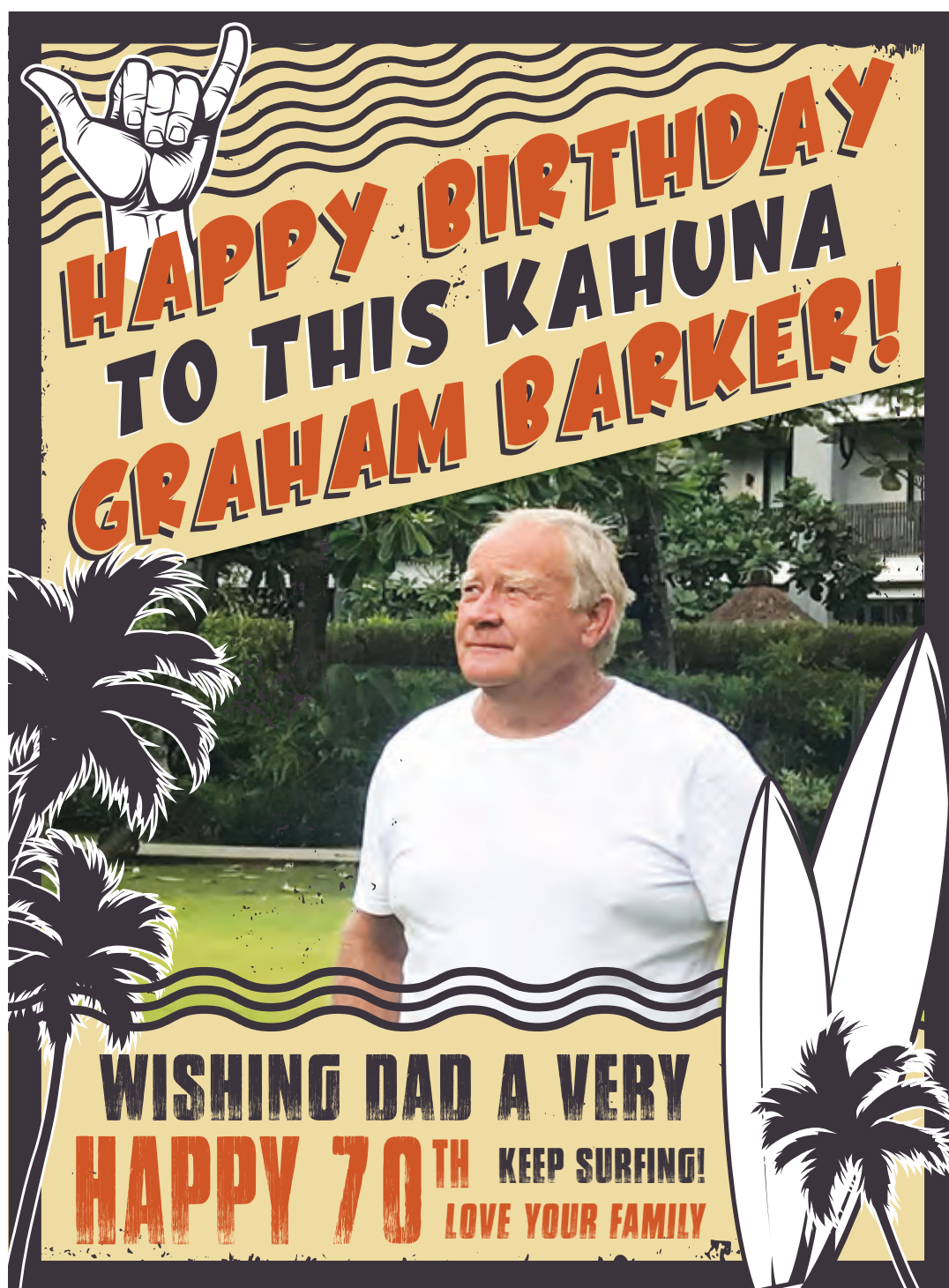
"This brand-new service between the Sunshine Coast and Cairns will feature 300 seats each way per week, will generate more than \$2 million for local businesses and support up to 20 jobs.

"Since flights went on sale on June 18, Alliance has sold more than 2800 tickets to date. This is a shot in the arm for both regions and will support thousands of local tourism businesses."

Alliance Airlines Chief Executive Officer Lee Schofield said the airline was proud to help provide another important link in its regional network.

"Alliance is a proud Queensland based-airline with close ties to regional Queensland since its inception.

"This new route linking two of Queensland's most beautiful regions further cements these ties," Mr Schofield said.

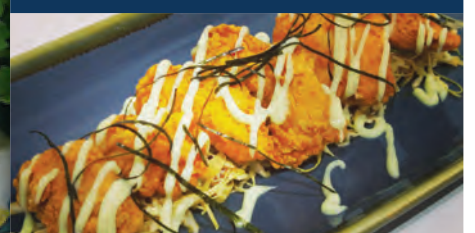
