A HUGE void will be left in the Coolum community with the Coolum Lionesses forced to cease operations following on from a directive from Lions International, with no firm reason given for the directive. All Lioness clubs throughout the world will be following suit and have been directed to join their local Lions club.

Coolum Lioness President Shirley Salisbury said that as yet none of the local women will be joining the Coolum Lions and that the decision created a lot of anger and disbelief.

"The first directive stated that there could be no new clubs and then the second directive said that we had to close by June 30 of this year... we were told this last year."

The decision has left all saddened including the Lions Club of Coolum with member Doug Alford stating that since their formation in 1978 they have been a key service in the Coolum community.

"The ladies have organised numerous events such as the annual Coolum Twilight Markets at Tickle Park, Aus-

tralia Day Breakfast, Meals on Wheels, supported the blood donation van, ran bingo for nursing home residents and raised funds at events which are too numerous to list."

That fundraising list is indeed long with Shirley stating that the Coolum Lionesses have raised about half a million dollars during their 42 years.

"I got satisfaction out of raising the money... it's been hard work over the years and we were not in this for praise – it was about helping others out," Shirley said.

Help others out they did with the first official project that the

Lionesses participated in being a 'stretcher-a-thon' where in conjunction with the Coolum Ambulance the participants pushed a stretcher along the David Low Way from Coolum to Bli Bli and asked for donations along the way. That was back in 1979.

From there the list of groups and people the Lionesses helped out financially is far to vast to list individually, however Shirley said highlights included helping out with the beach wheelchairs which enabled disabled people to get down to the water on Coolum main beach and also being involved with the Coolum High School Chap-

laincy program.

"We funded the beach wheelchairs and would escort people down to the beach in them and much joy was brought to those using the chairs and we had a very rewarding association with Mark the high school chaplain."

Then each summer since 1994 the ladies, in all weather conditions ran the Coolum Twilight Markets with all money raised from stallholder fees being put back into the local community.

From sausage sizzles, to selling raffle tickets and more the ladies will be missed in the community and Shirley said that they will still catch up.


"Maybe some of us will join other clubs in time, but for now I am happy to have a bit of a rest."

COASTAL FOX CONTROL PROGRAM SET TO BEGIN

THE COASTAL Fox Control Program will be underway again this autumn in an effort to protect our native wildlife from the predatory fox in coastal bushland areas from Maroochy River to Peregian Springs.

Sunshine Coast Council, Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service, Coolum and North Shore Coast Care and Noosa Council will work together to carry out the program between April 21 and

May 21. Environment Portfolio Councillor Maria Suarez said the program had achieved extremely positive results during its six years and it was vital the valuable work continued.

"The program plays an important part in protecting our endangered and threatened species," Cr Suarez said.

"We appreciate the support our community has given this program in the past and

with their ongoing support, we can continue to ensure the longevity and security of native species."

The program is designed to impact fox populations at a time when they were particularly active and reduce fox predation on vulnerable populations of native species, such as water mice, Eastern ground parrots, and endangered green and loggerhead turtles at the egg and hatching stage.

More information about the program is available on council's website.

Residents living near the program areas will be notified.

Areas included in the control program will be clearly identified by warning signs at all entrances. Please ensure your pets do not roam.

If you spot a suspected fox den in the program area, report it to council on 5475 7272. The European red fox is a restricted pest under the Queensland Government Biosecurity Act 2014.

Under the Biosecurity Act 2014, managing biosecurity, which includes invasive animals and plants, is a key responsibility of council and every Sunshine Coast resident.

I WAS delighted to announce some important resealing works for a notorious section of Yandina Coolum Road last week. Work is expected to start next month on resurfacing a five kilometre section of the road from just the other side of the Bruce Highway through to Valdora Road. For months I have been lobbying TMR for upgrades to this dangerous road, which locals have told me is an accident waiting to happen. I recently took a ride with a local truck driver to film just how bad the conditions are, which you can check out for yourself



on my Face book page. These resealing works won't fix all the problems, but it's a good start to our ongoing campaign to upgrade the road.

Work will also start soon on the installation of a CCTV camera at the intersection of David Low Way and Beach Road. According to TMR, the footage from the camera will be used to help monitor the traffic lights at the intersection, allowing the traffic management centre (TMC) operators to adjust signals when necessary. Given the massive

increase in local traffic, any investment in new technology to help address the congestion is welcome.

It's been great to see so much grant money being shared by local clubs and groups lately!

Congratulations to the latest recipients of Gambling grants, including Coolum Colts (\$35,000 for field lighting), Coolum Croquet Club (\$15,100 for a new shed), and Coolum Peregian RSL Sub Branch (\$35,000 for a van with disabled access). This follows the generous grants recently awarded by Coolum Surf Lifesaving Supporters Club, which distributed \$42,000 to some of most deserving community groups, including Coolum Hearts, Coolum Quota,

Coolum Beach Meals on Wheels, Coolum and North Shore Coast Care, St Vincent de Paul Coolum Beach, and Salvation Army.

Coolum Tennis has also benefitted from a much needed injection of funds, with the official opening of the new courts recently. It was a vast improvement from when I visited last year to announce the \$350,000 Works for Queensland funding, which was used to not only replace the four courts, but also upgrade the lighting and fencing. Sunshine Coast Council also contributed \$70,000 for the refurbishment, which I know will be well received by our ever-growing local tennis community.

MEN'S SHED TO HOLD LIFEFLIGHT FUNDRAISER

THIS SATURDAY April 17, the Coolum Beach Men's Shed will open their doors for a garage sale in support of the RACQ LifeFlight Rescue – the local helicopter rescue service on the Sunshine Coast.

In 2020 Sunshine Coast crews completed 502 critical missions, valued at more than \$12.5 million and those flights and services come at no costs to patients.

In the same year RACQ LifeFlight Rescue staff, including aircrew, medical, engineering and fundraising, had to quickly adopt new working procedures

- required as a result of the pandemic, while still providing the essential aero medical service without any interruption.

Due to COVID 19 the LifeFlight Foundation had to indefinitely postpone or cancel events, which contributed significantly to their operational costs, and a shortfall of 30 per cent resulted from the pandemic.

While the road to recovery will be a long one, the rescue chopper service has since been able to get back to fundraising activities. Most recently, the Sunshine Coast Gala Dinner

was held on March 27 and the event was the first time RACQ LifeFlight Rescue supporters were able to come together, since 2019, after last year's gala was cancelled.





"I congratulate the State government, the Sunshine Coast Council and the Coolum Tennis Club for working together to deliver this successful transformation."


