State COVID plan to unite families and protect Queenslanders

PREMIER Annastacia Palaszczuk has released Queensland's COVID Vaccination Plan to unite families, protect Queenslanders and chart a course through the next stages of the pandemic.

Key features include greater freedoms for those who are fully vaccinated including being able to cross the border from interstate hotspots in time for Christmas.

This will be achieved in cautious and measured stages once 70 and 80 per cent of eligible Queenslanders are double-dosed.

The Premier said how quickly these milestones are achieved depends on how quickly Queenslanders come forward to be vaccinated.

"It's simple," the Premier said.

"The more of us who are vaccinated, the sooner we are safely reunited with friends and family interstate and overseas."

As has been the case during the pandemic the steps are measured and cautious.



STATE COVID VACCINATION PLAN TO UNITE FAMILIES AND PROTECT QUEENSLANDERS

FROM PAGE 1

Key milestones are:
* At 70 per cent of Queensland's eligible population fully vaccinated (expected on November 19)

Anyone who has been in a declared domestic hotspot in the previous 14 days can travel into Queensland provided: They are fully vaccinated, arrive by air, have a negative COVID test in the previous 72 hours and undertake home quarantine for 14 days.

Direct international arrivals into Queensland will have to complete 14 days quarantine in Government-nominated facility as will arrivals who enter via another state or territory.

* At 80 per cent of Queensland's eligible population fully vaccinated (expected December 17)

Travellers from an interstate hotspot can arrive by road or air and they must be fully

vaccinated, they must have a negative COVID test in the previous 72 hours and no quarantine will be required.

Direct international arrivals can undertake 14 days (subject to review by AHPPC) home quarantine and subject to conditions set by Queensland Health provided they are fully vaccinated and have a negative COVID test in the previous 72 hours.

Those who don't meet these criteria will need to enter within Queensland's international arrivals cap and quarantine in a Government-nominated facility, just like now.

It is important for businesses to know, that at 80 per cent vaccination coverage, there will not be government financial assistance available in the event of increased restrictions or lockdowns.

* At 90 per cent of Queenslanders fully vaccinated
No entry restrictions or

quarantine for vaccinated arrivals from interstate or overseas. Unvaccinated travellers will need to apply for a border pass, or enter within the international arrivals cap, and undertake up to 14 days (subject to review by AHPPC) quarantine.

As of Monday October 18:
* 72.26 per cent of

Queenslanders have had one dose

* 56.58 per cent are fully vaccinated

* People who are fully vaccinated are 86 per cent less likely to catch COVID and pass it on.

* If you are fully vaccinated your chance of dying from COVID-19 falls by 90 per cent.

Please contact or walk into your local pharmacy or GP and ask about getting vaccinated.



A look back in time

THE CARNIVAL CONTINUES

SURELY there can be few people in this world who can remember that their lives were enriched by a "Big Gorilla rip-off"? However, there are a number of people who fondly remember it, the "Pirate Pete fete", and other such thrilling events at Coolum State School in the 1970s.

In 1971 (fifty years ago) Coolum State School had three teachers and 84 students. However, the rapid growth of the coastal strip from Peregian to Marcoola in the following six years meant that by 1977 there were 10 teachers and 202 students at the school. Schools are always provided with basic necessities, but in those days local people were expected to provide 'extras' which we would consider basic now. The Mother's Club, which was established in 1970, originally provided Tuck Shop food once a month, then fortnightly and weekly – and eventually twice a week.

School fetes were small in the early days and fundraising for improvements not provided by the Education Department was difficult in an area which was far from affluent. Many different activities were tried, with varying success. One year a turkey was donated,

but by the morning of the fete very few tickets had been purchased. To increase sales, Les Morgan drove around town with some ticket-sellers holding the turkey in a crab pot in the back of his ute. It was reported that the winner was horrified at winning a live bird but, it was said, "It was the only way we could keep things fresh in those days!"

On the fete day everybody pitched in to help, Jim Barns used to bring his tractor for rides, and Cliff Wright, the chairman of the P&C, used to bring his horse ... one year, the horse disappeared when its owner went for a cool drink – a frantic car chase found one of the boys riding it, way up the road!

Fundraising by the Coolum State School P&C raised \$685.00 in 1971, but by 1976 the P&C income had increased to \$7,123.00. In 1975, the "Big Gorilla Rip-off" fete was a huge success – so much so that the funds, with the aid of a government subsidy, were enough to build a Tuck Shop for the school – a modern, attractive area under the main brick building which cost \$2,400.00. In 1976 the "Pirate Pete Fete" raised enough money to build an Adventure Playground, constructed mainly from local timbers, at a total cost of \$2,500.00.

These, and subsequent fundraisers, built Coolum State School's complex to what we see today. The brilliant annual "Coolum Carnivals" which so many people enjoy, and which help school finances so much, continue ... why not join the fun this week?



DO YOU travel along Verrierdale Road, Verrierdale, at any stage during your day? Please be aware that reconstruction of a 900m section of the road is in progress.

It's quite a significant amount of work as Council will be completely removing and replacing the road base and so will need to close the road with redirections in place.

The existing road and base will be removed one lane

at a time. The subgrade will then be strengthened by lime stabilisation with the placement of a cement fortified gravel to follow. Once this lane has been completed to a bitumen seal standard, works will start on the opposite lane.

The project team is keen to complete these works in a timely manner and do their best to work with the community during construction.

I understand that there will

be some inconvenience for residents and businesses, but this upgrade really needs to be done and I thank you for your patience.

If you're able to, I'd recommend using Eumundi-Noosa Road and Emu Mountain Road while the work takes place.

TROY ASCOTT COOLUM STATE HIGH SCHOOL



AS THE great Bill Lawry used to say, "It's all happening". Our Year 12s are in their last week; in fact tomorrow is their last day, before their final exam period begins. Thirteen years of school (if you add in Prep) and it all comes down to this. The moment has arrived, and we believe our students are as well prepared as they possibly could be.

The test papers have been sent, the pencils have been sharpened and the desks carefully placed into the right position. "It's all happening" and everyone is set to go. I am sure our students will do us proud!

BARRIE JOHN WATTS PAROLE DENIED

Barrie John Watts parole denied

Welcome news for the Kingi family, who last week finally received the news that the parole application of convicted child killer Barrie Watts was denied. To those who are not familiar with this story, Watts was convicted of the heinous torture, rape and murder of 12 year old Sian Kingi in 1987. Earlier this year, the family and I tabled a petition in Parliament calling on the Queensland Parole Board to reject his parole application. It's been an agonising wait for the family, and I've made a commitment to them to ensure the government passes tough new laws to ensure that Watts and monsters like him never see the light of day again.

HOUSING CRISIS

Other than COVID, one of the most pressing social issues that I am regularly contacted about is the housing crisis our region is currently experiencing, and last week, I spoke about it in Parliament. Here on the Sunshine Coast, we have 3000 properties on the social housing register, with recent statistics indicating around 1,800 families on the wait list.

To make matters worse, the Sunshine Coast is one of the most expensive property markets, with a median house price of \$825,000. With the Government committing to just 140 new dwellings, it is clear that much more needs to be done to break the cycle of homelessness and housing stress.

One local business that is making a difference is Aussie Tiny Homes, located in the Coolum Industrial Park. I recently met with them to learn more about the innovative work they are doing with Noosa Shire Council, helping to meet the demand for housing for younger people. They have projected that next year alone, they will build over 200 tiny mobile homes that could be used for emergency accommodation or granny flats. While this will make only a small dent in an ever-growing problem, I applaud Fabio, Thiago and the team for all their hard work and innovation.

advanced, without compromising the ability to meet the needs of our future generations."

"I'm also proud our nomination has been shaped by the Sunshine Coast community through our extensive consultation process and the help of our dedicated Community Reference Group, the members of which partnered with council in 2019 to develop the nomination."

"A biosphere is a natural fit for the Sunshine Coast, as its values encompass those of our community, and our council's vision: Australia's most sustainable region – healthy, smart, creative."

"Our council now looks forward with anticipation, on the outcome of UNESCO's assessment, which is anticipated in June 2022."

DIGITAL HUB SHARES ITS AI TECHNOLOGY WITH CHERBOURG

THE EXPERTISE at Noosa's Peregian Digital Hub is helping an indigenous council to tap into the power of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and the new project was launched recently in Cherbourg.

Peregian Hub Director Chris Boden and two businesses based at the Hub have worked with Cherbourg Aboriginal Shire Council to source funding and develop a program to bring to life some of its cutting edge technology.

"With the support of two technologists based at the Hub Deborah van der Vlist and Laszlo Csabi, we have developed a project that aims to improve the recyclable containers at Cherbourg's Material Recovery Facility," Mr Boden said.

"Utilising AI technology, the system comprises a series of 3D cameras that monitor waste materials on conveyor belts and AI software that identifies individual items and counts them."

The analytics system is a collaboration between software development contractors based at the Peregian Digital Hub and the recycling facility experts based in Cherbourg.

"The system learns to detect a complex array of waste objects by being trained on a large database of labelled images which will be produced by the data team in Cherbourg."

"The data analysts segment objects in the images and assign them with the correct category and over time the software gradually learns to differentiate between objects like aluminium

cans and steel tins that can be in various states of disrepair," Mr Boden said.

Noosa CEO Brett de Chastel said it's another tangible example of the Hub's ongoing success.

"The facility is only three years old, but the expertise and innovation is world-class," Mr de Chastel said.

"This is a real partnership and collaboration involving the Peregian Digital Hub, Cherbourg and Noosa Councils, Advance Queensland and the Indigenous Land and Sea Corporation."

"The building blocks are now in place and hopefully the initiative will create meaningful high-value jobs in Cherbourg." Mr Boden said.






