Queenslanders set to reunite and return home with border to open

IT'S BEEN a long time coming and on Monday the Premier Annastacia Palaszczuk announced that the Queensland borders will reopen to domestic hotspots from 1am, Monday December 13 which made for welcome news for our local tourism industry.

The Premier said nominating a time and a date provides certainty for everyone.

The original plan to open was set for December 17 however with a target of 80 per cent double vaxxed set to be reached earlier, the border opening date was brought forward.

"It is clear we will reach our target of 80 per cent fully vaccinated much sooner although exactly when is difficult to predict," The Premier said.

Coolum Business and Tourism President Mark Cameron said the announcement was

## QUEENSLANDERS SET TO REUNITE AND RETURN HOME WITH BORDER TO OPEN

definitely a boost however questions still remained.

"The Queensland government has still not indicated how they will respond to the emergence of COVID in the community as we transition to living with the virus.

"It is inevitable as borders re-open that infection numbers in the state will rise and until more guidance is given there remains a great deal of uncertainty and travellers will not be confident to make forward bookings, and businesses will continue to grapple with planning for the future."

Mr Cameron said that the announcement was welcome but a very small step on the road back to recovery and the President did acknowledge that opening the border to southern visitors was key to a successful local tourism sector.

"Southern visitors are a key part of the Sunshine Coast tourism calendar, helping to drive year round visitation rather than travel just during the summer holiday period and it is with much anticipation that we look forward to being able to welcome our fellow Australians to Coolum once more."

Local State MP Dan Purdie also welcomed the announcement.

"The earlier opening of the border is welcome news for our tourism and hospitality sector, particularly in Coolum.

"Since the start of this pandemic, our small businesses have been on the front line, and to finally see some light at the end of the tunnel is just what they need as we head into their peak season," Mr Purdie stated.

As of 1am, Monday, December 13:

Travellers from interstate hotspots can arrive by road or air and they must be fully vaccinated and they must provide a negative COVID test in the previous 72 hours and no quarantine is required for fully vaccinated arrivals. All travellers from hotspots must get a test on day five after their arrival

International arrivals must be fully vaccinated and return a negative covid test within 72 hours of departure and they will be required to get a test on arrival and they must go into home or hotel quarantine for 14 days.

The Premier said Queensland's cautious approach had kept Queensland safe.

"We will live with COVID – but on our terms," the Premier said.

"We must continue to protect the freedoms Queensland has enjoyed throughout the pandemic and the best way to do that is to continue getting vaccinated."

Minister for Health Yvette D'Ath said it was a matter of when, not if, the virus began circulating more widely in Queensland.

"We know COVID is coming, we know case numbers will rise, but we can be as protected as possible by being fully vaccinated.

"Please make it a priority to protect yourself - the vaccine is safe, effective and free.

"We've always said as soon as we reach the 80 per cent target, we will open up Queensland's borders to reunite families this festive season."

"Reaching the 80 per cent fully vaccinated target means our community is better protected to handle COVID-19 as it reaches further into the state."

Minister D'Ath said from December 17 only fully vaccinated people will be permitted to enter pubs, clubs, cinemas, festivals and theme parks and visit vulnerable settings such as hospitals and aged care accommodation.

A RECENT community survey has shown that Sunshine Coast residents really value our natural environment. The Environment Levy supports a lot of activities that help to preserve our environment. At the recent Ordinary Meeting of Council, we were presented with the Environment Levy annual report which has an overview of the past year's activities including growing the land protected for conservation across our region; giving grants to landowners and community organisations so they can continue to tackle local environmental projects - which ultimately benefit us all; fighting invasive weeds; research and monitoring so we can adapt the way we manage our environment; and raising awareness about endangered species, such as the shorebirds. For more on the outcomes of the meeting, head to my Facebook page.

Over the past few weeks our region has experienced heavy rainfall with falls between 100mm and 200mm recorded. The forecast has predicted more significant rainfall over the coming weeks. As we all know, prolonged wet weather makes for a lot of mowing. Right now, our teams are out and about caring for our 1,069 hectares of parklands and reserves across the Sunshine Coast region – that's equivalent to 1,998 football fields. Our staff and contractors are working extremely hard to ensure we can service every site as soon

as possible however, we are experiencing some delays. Even when the wet weather clears, our regular schedule may need to change to allow green spaces to dry out - otherwise we can risk significant damage to our parks and grounds. I appreciate your patience as we resume services back to normal once conditions improve.

Council's customer contact counters and reception desks will be closed from 2pm December 24 and will reopen on January 4. From December 29 to 31 you can still contact council via phone, web chat, email and call back.

The Maroochydore Planning, Building, Plumbing and Development counter will also be closed during this time and any calls to 5475PLAN will be redirected to customer contact. Visit council's website for more details.

Have you got your tickets to the Festive Garden at Maroochy Bushland Botanic Gardens from December 17 to 21? It's set to be a pretty magical experience as the gardens are transformed into a magical wonderland where you're greeted by elves, serenaded by carollers and the night is aglow with a forest of twinkling lights. ### SHORT STAYS

Dear editor,  
Short-stay letting has a horrendous history. Damage to its reputation and property, is a gamble for investors and homeowners alike. Noosa Council's "Short -stay" law addresses controversial issues and the impact on residential amenity. (Advertiser, 24/11).

It concerns the regulation of minimum safety standards

of properties and a "code of conduct" for tenants, considering almost 90% of landlords live outside the shire, with half outside the state. With regard to behaviour issues of short-term tenants and complaints, the law requires the availability of local representatives on short notice.

This guarantees local complainants see immediate action over real concerns, with a 24-hour hotline monitored by security. Short-stay renting and home stay history,

are marred with disaster and horror stories. It is a lucrative risk owners are willing to take.

Noosa Council is aware of public expectations, after 600 written submissions from a concerned public, regarding the impact of short-term tenants on local harmony. This law clarifies the responsibilities for both landlords and renters, protecting all parties alike.

**POSITIVE GENERATIONAL CHANGE!**

ON SUNDAY, I attended the sold out performance of the Coolum Theatre Players 'Ladies in Black' directed by Linda Gefken. The theatrical performance by Carolyn Burns with music by Tim Finn is a wonderful musical that follows the lives of the women working in Ladies Wear in a Sydney department store in the 1950s over the Christmas holidays.

I worked for a number of years in various departments of Myers Coorparoo in my Christmas holidays and the workplace culture and the stereotypical gender roles of the 50s and 60s were quite familiar to me. Even though my partner and I were able to see the humour, the young women theatregoers sitting across from us may have been surprised, considering today's standards. I didn't see a smile when some of the negative views of the father were shared with his daughter aspiring to study literature at university.

The assumption that young women were not interested or clever enough to attend university and undertaking a professional career apart from teaching or nursing were widely held views. The caring father purchased a voucher for his daughter to go to a secretarial college. To be a secretary was not what the young daughter wanted and

the father finally relented - allowing an excellent student to pursue her dream to attend university.

The development of state and federal government legislation that accounts for equal employment opportunities and anti-discrimination laws has seen major shifts in the workplace and cultural stereotypes generally. Well, maybe not in the parliaments themselves with the recent report of the Sex Discrimination Commissioner showing significant problems. Where is the leadership by our politicians living the values enshrined in the

legislation?

There have been many positive changes, which give young women a much better chance to achieve professional careers or make a choice. However, there is still much work to do in getting women equally represented in leadership positions.

Change comes generation by generation and I have enjoyed mentoring young women into leadership roles with positive generational changes continuing. Young men are taking on or sharing important roles with home duties and child rearing which is allowing for much more equality of opportunity for all genders. The future is bright for both our young women and men.




