

GREEN WASTE BINS

Dear editor,
Ratepaying residents should be aware of the Sunshine Coast Regional Council's intention to impose a green waste bin upon all homes and units in the region (Advertiser, May). Previously, this bin was voluntary, available upon request, to allow ratepayers to separate garden organic waste from the normal household waste. It came at a cost, apart from the normal waste bin charges.

But council's latest move by stealth, comes as an extra cost, apart from the \$7 rate cost, for the weekly red bin and fortnightly yellow recycling bin, from every household. Council had no community consultation or advertised no previous notice about the council's intention to impose this by July 11, regardless. Council insists this is an environmentally progressive move to reduce garden waste in the red bins, which, in turn, reduces the impact on council's waste management.

Those diligent householders who mulch and compost their own garden waste, are exempt, but with compulsory photographic proof that they actually have a mulch pile active. There is a special council online form which must be completed with photo, to avoid this compulsory impost. This is yet another move by "Big Brother" to increase rate income, in the guise of being environmentally conscious.

Stay for an hour or stay for the day - this event will keep the whole family entertained as well as celebrating our beautiful environment and how we can preserve it and look after it.

Sunshine Coast Council Division 9 Councillor Maria Suarez said the region was lucky to have so many dedicated environment groups.

"They have been undertaking transformative actions for many years and this significant day is an acknowledgement of the great work they do," Cr Suarez said.

"They contribute to the environment and start conversations for future ideas and actions and it's exciting to think that this year marks 50 years of this event and that's certainly something to celebrate."

Venue 114 and Community Spaces Manager Louise Thompson said she was pleased to see Coolum Civic Centre host the event.

"This adds to Venue 114's EarthCheck Evaluate Status and our community spaces working towards a commitment to supporting sustainable outcomes," Ms Thompson said.

Green art activities will run throughout the event with local artist Chony Bowden who facilitates the Monday morning art class at Coolum HeARTs running a Collective Collage where participants can contribute to a shared visual story of the Sunshine Coast.

"I will be providing carbon printed images of local flora and fauna that live on the Sunshine Coast and people who attend the event will have the opportunity to use eucalyptus oil to transfer the image onto a large piece of beautiful cartridge paper.

"Once the chosen image has been transferred, a variety of materials such as pens, charcoal and crayons can be used to 'highlight' or work into the transferred image," Chony said.

"The aim of this workshop is to create a collective community mural, that

highlights the beauty and diversity of our flora and fauna while exploring an art technique that has minimal environmental impact and mixes science with art."

ELECTION WRAP - TED O'BRIEN SECURES THIRD TERM FOR FAIRFAX

IT WAS a night of celebration in Fairfax on Saturday May 21 with LNP sitting member Ted O'Brien claiming a third term in office, and whilst the LNP did not come back to form government nationally, Ted said that he was humbled to be re-elected and was very grateful to the local community.

"Although I am delighted to have been re-elected, I am also conscious that the Liberal-National Government lost office and there was also a swing against the LNP locally.

"There is no shortage of political commentary explaining the 'why' of the election result, but I'd prefer to hear personally from local residents who I serve as Member for Fairfax," Ted said.

In an effort to find out what the community does think, Mr O'Brien will be conducting a road trip to meet locals across the electorate in the week beginning Monday June 6 and has also launched a survey (see www.tedobrien.com.au).

"My hope is to learn every possible lesson from the election so that I can better represent our local community in the next term of government."

Many of the national swings against the LNP and lost seats were in what were considered safe seats with these falling to the 'teal independents' who made climate change a big-ticket item on their ballot.

"Climate change will continue to be an important factor moving forward," Mr O'Brien said.

"I was proud to have helped lock-in a commitment to a 'climate positive' Olympic and Paralympic Games when negotiating our bid to host the 2032 Games and I was also happy to secure Federal funding for the Blue Heart environmental project only a couple of months ago.

"Protecting our way of life has always been a priority for me, and that includes protecting our local environment and this will continue to be the case moving forward."

Sue Ferguson who was the ALP candidate for Fairfax said that despite not winning, the team were happy with their result and the swing to the ALP in Fairfax was a good result.

At the time of going to print figures showed that all parties secured swings to them apart from the LNP, One Nation and an independent who all recorded swings against them.

"We went in wanting to win but what we did get was an incredible result and it was all done by an incredible team - no one was paid," Sue said.

"I heard time and time again at the polling booths that people want change, and many want an ALP member in Fairfax and this one was all about building trust."

"It was an incredible result overall for the ALP and it has shown that people want the atrocities in aged care fixed, our First Nations people to be

recognised in our constitution and action on climate change.

Sue went on to say that she heard that climate change was a big concern for many people whilst campaigning and stated that it was only an ALP member for Fairfax who would see change in that area.

Ms Ferguson was back at her day job on the Monday after the election where she works as an outreach nurse for Sunny Street - delivering care for the homeless across the coast, however she intends to run again.

"I will be sticking around - and coming back in three years. I loved this and want

to represent the people of Fairfax."

Mr O'Brien stated that he intended to continue fighting for the residents on the coast.

"It will be a different term in office, now that we're in opposition and not in government.

"While this may make

things more difficult, you can be sure that my commitment to work day and night serving our local community remains unchanged."

IT WAS a day of community celebration on Tuesday May 31 with Coolum Beach Meals on Wheels celebrating 40 years of service within the local community. On the same day in 1982 the charity organisation delivered their first meal within the Coolum community.

President Sue Green said that the celebratory lunch which was held on their premises on

Santa Monica Avenue was their way to say thank you to their amazing volunteers.

“It is exactly 40 years since we first started delivering meals to the aged and disabled in our community.

“The main people who we want to celebrate with are our volunteers as without them we couldn’t run our service and we also have all of our staff here and we also invited other community members along and local businesses who always help us – we also want to say

thanks to the community who help us,” Sue said.

When asked just how many meals were delivered over the past 40 years Sue declared that the number would easily be over 100,000.

“Each year we send out close to 16,000 meals, so we have definitely made and sent out a lot of meals over the past 40 years.”

Coolum Beach Meals on Wheels are aiming to still be around for another 40 years – providing a much needed ser-

vice for those needing a warm meal and a friendly visit and as always new volunteers are always welcomed.

“We do need new volunteers – coming out of COVID we have seen that some of our volunteers are now travelling again so please come and see us if you would like to volunteer either as a kitchen volunteer or as a delivery driver.”

Defence Abuse

Final month to apply for reparation payment

Under the Defence Reparation Scheme, individuals who served in the Australian Defence Force, and experienced serious abuse before 30 June 2014, can report this abuse to the Commonwealth Ombudsman. You may be eligible for a reparation payment but you must act by 30 June 2022.

You must send the Commonwealth Ombudsman either a report of your abuse by midnight 30 June 2022, or an email stating your intent to report the abuse – email DefenceForce.Ombudsman@Ombudsman.gov.au by midnight 30 June 2022 AEST. Your email notification of intent to report will enable you to report up until midnight 30 June 2023.

NOOSA deserves its international sporting success accolades with the Noosa Triathlon Series, Runaway Noosa Marathon and the Ultraman (UM) to name a few. I was a spectator at the Noosa Marathon, Half Marathon and 10 Kilometre events staged on Saturday and Noosa was packed for the running on Saturday and ocean swims on Sunday.

The sporting events fill the accommodation and restaurants with patrons and the healthy vibe of people committed to excellence in sport or just having ago for the fun and enjoyment is a pleasure to be around. While the streets are closed off and beaches have some new temporary fencing, the disruption seems to mean most people are happy.

Events like the Ultraman which was staged from May 7-9 this year include:

Many of these events are held across the Sunshine Coast and are not limited to the Noosa Shire, so hopefully the whole Sunshine Coast will benefit from increased accommodation bookings and other benefits when these events do take place.

There is a great deal of work required on the coastal pathway which is currently still flooded in several locations within the North Shore region. It is important that the pathway is maintained and developed for active transport as well as sports events.

There is still the opportunity to develop a sporting hub here on the Maroochy North Shore and more facilities like running tracks and an aquatic centre with a 50m pool are really needed.

The Southeast Queensland Olympics in 2032 is nearing and we can leave a legacy of health and wellbeing for future generations and with that everyone can enjoy the success.

Fishing

BAIT MASTER FISHING AND TACKLE

THIS WEEK'S cold snap has welcomed winter with a chilly blast. Winter is a great time for Flathead and Bream in the rivers, Tailor and Trevally for beach fishing, and Snapper and Sweetlip offshore. Rainfall totals have continued to be high which has resulted in record dam levels across the southeast. With the upcoming Sunshine Coast Show holiday and clearer weather, it's a great time to head out to some of our local dams to wet a line.

Ewan Maddock Dam, located 5km north of Landsborough, is stocked with Mary River Cod, Australian Bass, Golden Perch and Saratoga. The dam is open to non-motorised vessels only, so is an ideal spot for kayaks and canoes and land-based fishos. It's a great spot for a fish, bushwalk or a barbie, with amenities and BBQ facilities

available. The dam is currently over 100 per cent full.

Lake MacDonald, near Cooroy, is another great option. Stocked with Australian Bass, Golden Perch, Mary River Cod and Silver Perch, the dam is currently sitting at around 103 per cent capacity. Lake MacDonald's facilities include toilets, barbeques, picnic tables, shelters and a playground.

Our pick of the local dams would have to be Borumba Dam near Imbil. This picturesque location includes great fishing with Australian Bass, Golden Perch, Mary River Cod and Silver Perch, plenty of amenities including BBQ facilities and a kiosk, and camping is available at Lake Borumba Caravan and Camping Grounds or Borumba Deer Park. If you're looking for a relaxing weekend of fishing and fun, this is definitely the spot.

If you're looking to head a bit further away from the coast, Somerset and Wivenhoe Dams are excellent options with plenty of Australian Bass, Golden Perch, Silver Perch, Saratoga

and Mary River Cod.
