#### **E-SCOOTERS**

Dear editor.

Trying to modify the behaviour of cyclists on shared paths, with the rules, is a path too far! Who are the bike and e-scooter police, enforcing the laws governing cyclists, skate-board riders, and scooters? Where are they and do they exist?

The rule for shared paths, like the rule for sea craft, is 'Power gives way to sail'. Reform to the laws protecting the public from potential interactions with electric and other vehicles on pathways, is hypothetical, not practical, and difficult, if not impossible, to enforce. In the case of an accident, where walkers collide with these pathway vehicles, who is there to record the incident and report? In many cases, fast getaways are the norm, especially when the incident is without witnesses.

Considering many of the elderly tend to walk on pathways, they play Russian roulette, subjected to speeding riders. Many are frail and any fall is critical. Children are also at risk on shared pathways, considering their lack of safety awareness, especially when very young. All of us have a right to walk safely on pathways open to the public. No-one has a right of way, just because their mode of transport is electric or has wheels. The sea rule applies to pathways also.

The revised law for e-scooters, after many dangerous incidents involving speeding riders, has reduced the speed limit for e-scooters, to 12 km per hour. All moving vehicles need a bell or similar means of warning when approaching pedestrians. However, who is prepared to police this new status for e-scooters, knowing other vehicles on pathways more often than not, don't use, or have a bell for warning. Speeding past walkers without warning, is an accident waiting to happen.

#### ATURE TOPS SURVEY LIST FOR RESIDENTS CESS TO N

THE results are in, and Sunshine Coast residents listed access to nature, neighbourhood safety, quality health services, sporting facilities and education as being at the top of the list as to what makes an area great to live in and thankfully our Northshore region has plenty of great outdoor space.

More than 1500 residents completed the 2022 Living on the Sunshine Coast community survey and provided their insight into which liveability attributes matter the most, what needs to be maintained, what can be improved and how they feel their local area is currently delivering.

When considering what makes a place liveable, locals

placed the most importance on access to the natural environment, with 71 per cent of respondents scoring it as the number one feature of their neighbourhood – comparatively higher than the national benchmark of 48 per cent.

Out of 16 attributes, respondents also nominated community safety, a lack of road congestion, a strong sense of community, and the provision of high-quality health services amongst the top five most important 'liveability' traits.

When asked what needed to be maintained, locals felt most passionate about preserving the natural environment, neighbourhood safety, our sense of

community, provision of health services, and shopping/leisure amenities.

To further advance liveability of the Sunshine Coast, housing affordability and improved connectivity to get around were on the top of the list for survey respondents.

Sunshine Coast Council Environment and Liveability Portfolio Councillor Maria Suarez said the survey results provided an invaluable insight into the current and future needs of the community.

"Sunshine Coast residents are passionate about their local area and have clear ideas about what makes it a great place to live," Cr Suarez said

"By capturing the views and

experiences of the community we can better inform, monitor and evaluate our strategic planning and advocacy across our region."

"In line with our Environment and Liveability Strategy 2017, council is constantly seeking ways to maintain the current liveability of its residents, as well as implementing actions that improve how locals live, work and play in the community," Cr Suarez said.

"Recently, our region received international recognition as a UNESCO biosphere, which shows the world that we are a community that wants to live in harmony with our environment.

"In view of this, it comes as no surprise that residents sit above the national benchmark when it comes to appreciating the access to, and preservation of, our natural environment.

"It's important the Sunshine Coast has a sustainable community, a sustainable environment and a sustainable economy and this data will help us work towards our shared vision of a sustainable and liveable future."

The survey was conducted by Informed Decisions Consulting in March this year.

An executive summary of the survey is now available on the Sunshine Coast Council website.

# Sunshine Coast Council receives multimillion dollar Blue Carbon grant

BLUE Carbon ecosystem restoration on the Sunshine Coast has received a major boost thanks to a \$2 million grant to support the Blue Heart project.

Sunshine Coast Council and its grant partners were successful in securing the funding through the Commonwealth government's Blue Carbon Ecosystem Restoration Grants.

This is in addition to a further \$1.5 million in in-kind contributions that is being provided by partners.

Sunshine Coast Council
Mayor Mark Jamieson said the
Blue Heart was one of five successful Blue Carbon restoration
projects the Federal Government was supporting across
Australia.

"Blue Carbon is carbon that is stored in marine and coastal ecosystems and includes carbon stored in the bodies of plants and animals as well as in debris and soil," Mayor Jamieson said.

"Our Blue Heart will contribute to further progressing our collective understanding of Blue Carbon ecosystems and the benefits they provide to biodiversity, fishing, water quality, recreation and coastal protection.

"As Blue Carbon 'farming' is a potential economic opportunity for Blue Heart private landholders, the grant funding provides a timely opportunity to demonstrate Blue Carbon restoration and the associated benefits."


The Blue Heart is an area of more than 5,000 hectares on a natural floodplain in the Maroochy River catchment and includes approximately 1,400 hectares of public land. This comprises council's Coolum Creek Environment Reserve network, the Queensland Government's Coolum Creek Conservation Park, and Unitywater's Yandina Creek Wetland.

The Blue Heart provides flood storage for the Maroochy River Catchment and preserving flood storage within this area is critical to the ongoing flood management of the catchment and in particular the built environment.

This floodplain area is already impacted by tidal inundation and over time the area is expected to continue transitioning due to climate change and projected sea level rise.

This project seeks to manage the land and water through this transition to provide positive outcomes for our environment, community, and economy.

"The Blue Heart is another way council is planning and acting in response to climate

change, Mayor Jamieson said.
Sunshine Coast Council
Environment and Liveability Portfolio Councillor Maria
Suarez said the funding was a great encouragement to the project and reinforced just how important the Blue Heart was to our region as one of our major green spaces.

"The project to restore Blue Carbon ecosystems on public land in the northern section of the Blue Heart will be implemented over the next four years (2022-2025) with a focus on restoring degraded or destroyed Blue Carbon ecosystems," Cr Suarez said.

"Council plans to do this

by implementing various ecosystem restoration activities, including introducing tidal waters onto selected public lands and working with nature as it transitions from former cane lands to Blue Carbon ecosystems.

"We'll now be able to implement this across a larger space due to our most recent Blue Heart land acquisition along River Road, Maroochy River, extending council's conservation footprint across the Sunshine Coast."

#### **CHARGES LAID FOLLOWING** FATAL CRASH ON MOTORWAY

A MAN has been charged following a fatal traffic crash in Coolum Beach in May this year.

Forensic Crash Investigators last week charged a 36-year-old Coolum Beach man with two counts each of dangerous operation of a vehicle causing death or Grievous Bodily Harm and one count each of drug driving and driver failing to restrain a child under four.

Around 2.15pm on Monday May 30, police will allege the man was driving a silver Mitsubishi Pajero southbound on the Sunshine Motorway when it collided with a Mazda CX-9 heading

Two three-year-old pas-

sengers were seated in the rear of the 4WD. The male child suffered critical injuries and passed away in the Sunshine Coast University Hospital the following day. The man and female child sustained minor injuries only.

The 38-year-old female driver of the Mazda and a 12-year-old female passenger sustained serious and significant injuries and were discharged from hospital only last week. A four-yearold male passenger from this vehicle sustained minor injuries only.

The man was granted police bail and will appear in Maroochydore Magistrates Court on Friday August 26.

#### A look back in time

**FRANCES WINDOLF** A LONG TIME COOLUM RESIDENT WITH A PASSION FOR LOCAL HISTORY

#### UP, UP IN THE AIR!

COOLUM has always been a favourite place for people to visit – with the glorious sun, surf and sand of Coolum's pristine beaches, attractive park areas and coastal walks which provide wonderful recreational opportunities for visitors and residents of all ages, there are other attractions which have delighted many people over the last century. From late 1922, when buyers of house blocks at Coolum were wooed by advertisements describing "... hard and level sand - where later on the motor speedsters will score in a straight 5 to 10 mile run at 80 to 100 mph." The excitement of car, motorcycle and horse racing on the beach drew people to visit our shores. In the 1930s keen visitors and locals could, for a small cost, ride horses and even camels along the beach.

For several decades after that first sale, young and old alike enjoyed "tobogganing" on the northfacing slope below today's Low's Lookout, sliding down the grass slopes of what was then called "Green Hill", but soon became "Toboggan Hill" – a name which persisted for more than seventy years. The steep slope and shiny grass was a perfect base for speeding children and adults riding a range of devices from smart wooden speedsters to kitchen trays. Wooden fruit-packing cases, and the unsophisticated fronds of the Archontophoenix palm which grew locally were also used to slide down the hill.

In the new millennium however, sliding downhill on a palm frond is a long way from the wonderful pursuits available to those who live near, or visit Coolum Beach. In October 2000 the Coolum Kite Festival attracted some 12,000 people marvelling at huge kites of many shapes, By 2003 the crowd at the Coolum

Kite Festival had swollen to 18,000, and the following year, when the festival was held in September, 30,000 people swarmed onto Coolum Beach to enjoy the colourful spectacle. Coolum Beach Lioness Club prepared and sold hundreds of serves of strawberries and cream from 2001, and the festival continued to be a great fundraiser for Coolum Lions and Lionesses until 2009. In later years, the Kite Festival moved closer to Brisbane, and found a new home at Redcliffe.

COLD mornings and sunny days have provided a perfect backdrop for recent community events, and I have been thrilled to attend so many between Budget Estimates Hearings and endless meetings! From the Tewantin Noosa Red Cross AGM celebrating all they do for our community, to the Pet Expo raising funds for PTSD Dogs, and a record-breaking citizenship ceremony with 86 new Aussies (Noosans!!) and every letter of the alphabet represented by a country, that is just a tiny sample!

Congratulations to the 23 Noosa electorate businesses who received Business Basics funding of \$5000 each, and to all our organisations who received funding under round 113 of the Community Benefit Fund. This has enabled varied projects for our community including the upgrading of kitchens to repairing flooring, as well equipment for sporting groups and wildlife rescuers.

Housing continues to be an issue, and as I have reported, it was disappointing that there was insufficient provision in the extra funds in the Budget to quickly address the volume across QLD. With worker accommodation projects at application stage, the reality is we may still have at least two years before the current crisis impacting our community eases, however you may be able to help. How? We put the call out last year for property owners to 'head lease' with our community housing providers, such as Coast2Bay and Purpose Real Estate at Tewantin, and the Help to Home initiative is open until October 31 which provides incentives to private investors to sign up with a guaranteed rental income for two years, paid three months in advance, and then every quarter subject to the terms of the lease. Expressions of Interest (EOIs) are available at www. yoursayhpw.engagementhq. com/help-to-home. We have also committed funds for an expansion of the 'Better Together' share house program, so if you have thought about renting out your spare room or rooms, this could be for you! More information will be available shortly.




Peregian.

# Calling all historians for resident program

HISTORY experts are invited to join Sunshine Coast Council's Historian in Residence Program, which is now in its second year.

The invitation follows the success of the inaugural residency which included two historians, University of the Sunshine Coast PhD student Kate Kirby and Dr Ray Kerkhove, who undertook local history research to produce a series of papers that will soon be published.

The Historian in Residence program provides for two, three-month, paid contract positions.

The three months need to be completed within the financial year but not necessarily consecutively. Submissions of interest close Wednesday, August 24, 2022.

Sunshine Coast

Council Heritage Portfolio Councillor Rick Baberowski said the program was an excellent way to further develop our collective backstory and further increase our understanding of where we live.

"We are looking for qualified and experienced historians who will immerse themselves in a research project that will reveal, document and showcase aspects of our region's history and heri-

tage," Cr Baberowski said.
"This program includes important community days where residents can offer up their knowledge on the historian's chosen topic that could add depth or possible leads to their research.'

Stories could evolve

from existing council collections, an historic event, contemporary topic, or be based on an identified gap in an existing body of historical work.

"We encourage but are not prescribing using council's diverse collections as a potential starting base (acknowledging, there are plenty in community ownership), which means the historians can really work towards filling in some interpretation gaps in our Sunshine Coast history collection.'

The selected subject could be anything from natural history, early agriculture to the development of civil and social infrastructure, specific industries, or tourism—all historians can submit their own topic preference.

Cr Baberowski further

went on to say that they were hoping to receive interest from a diverse range of historians including archaeologists, heritage librarians, museologists, archivists, teachers, heritage architects and Traditional Custodians.

"It is encouraging and important to note that during the consultation process, which informed the Sunshine Coast Heritage Plan 2021-31, the community identified this program as an important outcome."



#### Police urging Dog owners to have caution following baiting

SUNSHINE Coast Police are investigating recent social media reports that several dogs have died recently from possibly ingesting poison type substances after visiting the Point Cartwright and Buddina beach areas.

Investigations are being undertaken into these reports and it is important that if you believe your dog has been affected that this matter is reported to

Some symptoms that may indicate that your dog has ingested something poisonous include:

- Vomiting
- Diarrhoea, possibly bloody
- High temperature · Lethargic

• Rapid breathing

If investigations determine that these were intentional acts there are several offences that relate to this matter and include the following:

· Serious animal cruelty (s242 Criminal Code 1899) a person who, with the intention of inflicting severe pain or suffering, unlawfully kills, or causes serious injury or prolonged suffering to, an animal commits a crime. Maximum

penalty—7 years imprisonment.

• Cruelty offences (Animal Care and Protection Act 2001) which include killing an animal in an inhumane, causing it not to die quickly or to die in unreasonable pain. Maximum penalties of 2000 penalty units or 3 years imprisonment.

· Baits or harmful substances (Animal Care and Protection Act 2001) states that a person must not, with the intention of injuring or killing an animal

administer or feed the animal a substance the person is harmful or poisonous to the animal or lay a bait. Maximum penalty of 300 penalty units or 1 year imprisonment.

Dog owners are encouraged to report any incidents to police and if you have any information about the incidents to contact Policelink on 131 444 or Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

The RSPCA can also be contacted on 1300ANIMAL.
